Woman claims ridicule by energy minister

An Open letter to Hon. Wm. G. Davis
Premier of Ontario:
On the 16th of Dec a Brand-FM radio station CKPC carried a telephone interview between myself and the Minister of Energy Hon. Dennis Timbrell concerning the proposed Bradley-Milton 500Kv cordior.

On that program I voiced what I consider to be very legitimate concerns for the health and safety of myself and my three small children. These concerns are greatly increased because Ontario Hydro is still insisting on crossing our land from corner to corner.

Mr. Timbrell however, called me "highly irresponsible"
