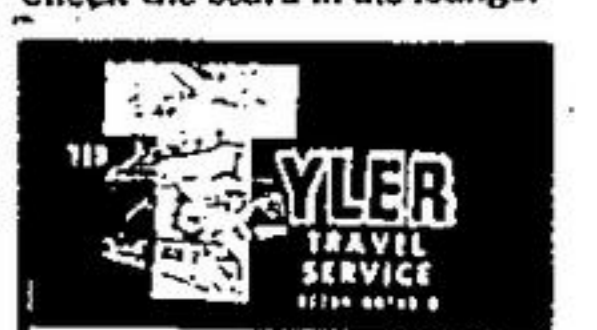

## MEXICO

SHOPPING: BIRD IN THE HAND IS WORTH TWO IN THE BUSH

Do not put off a buying trip to Mexico - the peso-dollar relationship has produced astonishing prices.

A bird in the hand is worth two in the bush, and tourists bent on cornering the best buys in Mexican goods would be smart to do their shopping in Mexico now before anticipated price increases materialize and perhaps wipe out dollar gains created by the recent halving of the peso's worth.

Yes, savings on buys compared to last summers prices are astonishing, you will save most on luxury goods. For example, designers clothing is being sold at 50% off. The peso was allowed to float on the world market after being tied to the American dollar for 20 years at 12.5 to a dollar. Since early autumn, the peso has ridden the stormy waves of rising oil prices, value, buffeted by such indignities as a massive run on the Mexican banks in mid-November and deep-rooted uneasiness by increases in national debt. Their cost of living was becoming prohibitive.

Indeed, the time is ripe for a trip to the nations capital. Tourists will find their dollar worth about 19 to 22 pesos. The dollar is a check full of goods to buy. But don't expect to bargain on wares already in their shops. Shopkeepers will sell what tourists want in the way of silver, leather, handicrafts or clothing, but they will balk at discounting prices further than the devaluation has forced them to do.

There's no bargaining anymore. A good piece of silver cost now \$40 to \$50 dollars. It was \$100 last summer.

Tourists will find their best buys in goods already on vendors' shelves and, most certainly in goods made in Mexico.

How long the bargain rates continue is anyone's guess. Profitshare has been to a razor's edge.
