

# Rebels a close second in Grey Highlands meet

Georgetown Wrestling team travelled to Flesherton Jan. 9 to compete in the Grey Highlands Invitational. This tournament featured teams from as far away as Waterloo, Waterloo and Kitchener.

With 228 wrestlers competing, many weight classes contained over 10 athletes.

Although there were 19 teams present, two powerhouses dominated the meet. Roland Mitchener and Georgetown captured 11 of 15 weight classes.

Mitchener, with 11 of 15 wrestlers in Grade 13, have a powerful team this year and will be a threat at OFSA.

However, Georgetown, with nine rookies, still placed a close second.

The coaches were pleased with the effort of all wrestlers and noticed a great team spirit.

"We had the best rookies there," Coach Bob McKay said, "look at the results, the young guys pinned veterans." The veterans were holding their own, as well.

With four of six wrestling up a weight class, all wrestled to their physical best.

"Win or lose, effort is what counts. Effort shows when you work harder than the others at practice, and are self disciplined to make weight," Coach Ray Smith stated.

"Finishing low does not mean you are not as good as someone who placed first."

The team wrestled to their maximum, with Rick Rodgers the top wrestler. Rick was also voted the outstanding wrestler of the tournament.

Steve Turner appeared to have few obstacles as he captured the trophy at 194

pounds. Steve is undefeated for the year.

Frank Miedzinski, at 90 pounds, continued to defeat all opponents as he captured first place.

Rookie Jerry Paul was a surprise, finishing second behind teammate Scott Hall at 83 pounds.

At 100 pounds, Bill Davis placed third.

Rick Rodgers and Dean Scallen placed first and second at 108 pounds.

Pete Fournier and Joe Ibuki wrestled at 117 pounds. Pete Fournier placed 4th, while Joe failed to place.

In the largest weight class of the day, Brian Pendergast and Todd Bradley finished sixth and ninth respectively in a field of 25. This was at 125 pounds. At 143 pounds, Jeff Skingley wrestled well but met stiff competition and finished

fifth.

Dave Taggart, at 150 pounds, shocked many veterans as they found themselves upset by a rookie. Taggart was superb and placed third.

At 159 pounds, Brent Collier came up flat and placed a disappointing 10th.

In the team championship, Roland Mitchener finished first with 90 points. The Rebels were second with 74 points.

John F. Ross, C.V.I. placed third with 37 points, and Grey Highland fourth with 29.

The next action is this Saturday at Georgetown and district high school.

This tournament, the Georgetown Invitational is probably the most prestigious tournament in Ontario, next to the provincial championships. The Rebels will be in action all day, so come out and support the team.
