20 babysitters graduate YM-YWCA course

Twenty babysitters received certificates Saturday after successfully completing an eight-week course sponsored by the YM-YWCA.

The babysitters aged from 12 and up were required to attend seven lectures, prepare an essay and complete a test before being credited.

The 20-member group heard lectures from several local parents and professionals.

They were required to learn about the characteristics of a babysitter; child care and safety; first aid; handicapped and retarded children; child behaviour; fire safety; health of the babysitter; and entertaining young children.

Cheryl Lightowers who headed the course said five students were dropped after they missed two lessons. As part of their course, students

were required to babysit six hours each.

Assistance was given by Bev. Wheatcroft and Joanna Dobbin. Lecturers included Helen Van Sickle; Dr. Robert Petrie and son Kelly 3; Bob Simpson of the Georgetown Volunteer Ambulance Service; Fire Chief Ken Bulkema; Betty Hager and Marg Lamothé.

Renaissance delays action pending board discussions

The legal threat against the Halton board of education by Halton Renaissance has been delayed in hopes differences can be peacefully resolved.

Founded by Baptist evangelist Rev. Ken Campbell three years ago, Renaissance was barred from board meetings in December, 1975, for "persistent dishonesty and personal abuse in the deliberate misinformation of the public."

The censure followed the receipt of two letters by Rev. Campbell sent to Education Minister Tom Wells, MPPs, and trustees, criticizing the ministry's Values Education

project in Halton.

In December the board turned down a request by a trustee to withdraw the censure.

The decision to defer legal action followed a meeting Jan. 12 between Rev. Campbell and the newly-elected board chairman Rev. Gary Morton.

A press release from Renaissance states they are "working together in a quest for an honorable resolution to the tensions which for three years dominated relations between the board and Renaissance."

Rev. Campbell who describes the educational establishment as a "bully", maintains

his criticisms were constructive, campaigns issue-oriented and that apologies were delivered for factual inaccuracies and unintentional insults.

The election of the new board in December recharged Renaissance with optimism that it's long-running battle with the board could end in a truce.

Co-operation is being sought from Mr. Wells, superintendent of instruction John Bolch and Rev. Morton to establish "A satisfactory solution to this urgent issue."

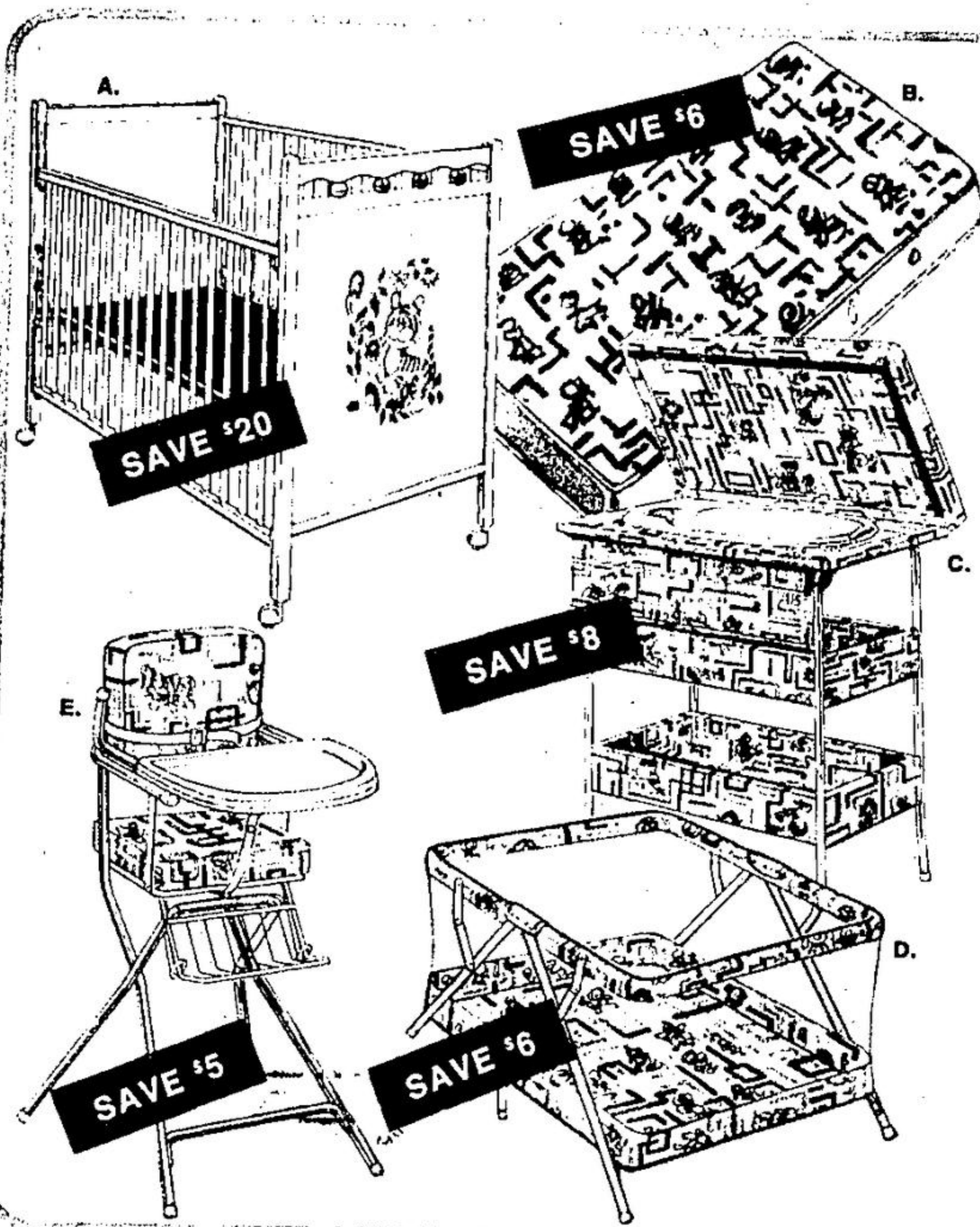
