No stop signs approved for Acton

Despite complaints and requests from residents, neither Churchill Road nor the Cobblehill Road - Victoria Street intersection in Acton will become the sites of new three way stop signs, if town council accepts a works committee recommendation.

The committee Monday supported the judgment of town engineer Bob Austin that stop signs at the two locations would do nothing to slow down the speeding cars that prompted several Acton residents to

seek council action last year in the interest of children's safety.

Mr. Austin stated that Halton Regional Police Superintendent Floyd Schwartz similarly advised against the installation of stop signs at Cobblehill - Victoria and at Churchill Road and Orville Boulevard.

Police failed to apprehend a single speeding motorist during a seven-hour radar survey at the latter location Nov. 30 Mr. Austin said.

Agreeing with Coun. Pat McKenzie that motorists do

indeed exceed the posted 30 miles per hour speed limit along both streets, committee Chairman Mike Armstrong pointed out that the offence is not as common during the winter, and suggested that a second survey be made in the spring.

Coun. McKenzie took exception to Superintendent Schwartz's report that Churchill Road "does not lend itself to high-speed traffic," and asked Mr. Austin what alternatives to stop signs he proposed.

Stressing that the "slowing down of traffic" is a police responsibility, Mr. Austin stated that police radar is the only viable control. Stop signs, he said, have been shown in studies to do little or nothing in deterring speeders. Instead, the motorist will drive even faster after coming to a stop at the sign in order to compensate for lost seconds, he said.

Mr. Austin suggested that radar units need only be set up at the locations for two hours a day and two weeks a year.

Coun. McKenzie was the sole opponent to the committee's denial of requests for the three way stop signs. Mr. Austin will conduct a new survey before May 1.

Works chairman a tricky business

Town works committee found itself facing a tricky problem Monday after appointed committee member Mike Armstrong, a Ward 4 area councillor, was selected by council to replace Ric Morrow as Ward 4 regional councillor.

In its first item of business of the new term, the committee faced the problem of providing fair representation for Ward 4

while at the same time balancing its own representation on the regional council.

Coun. George Malby pointed out that Coun. Armstrong's re-assignment had resulted in the works committee having three regional councillors among its members, while the newly-combined finance and administration committee had only one.

The matter was further complicated when the other two regional councillors, Roy Booth and Pat McKenzie, declined either to transfer to the finance committee, or to take the works committee chair.

Coun. McKenzie explained that he served last year on the regional public works committee with the intention of following up his work in that field at the local level this year. Both Coun. McKenzie and Coun. Booth pointed out that last year they served on the Finance and Administration Committee, respectively, and neither initially wished to return to the same areas of responsibility.

Coun. Armstrong stated that his transfer to the finance committee would leave the works committee without a Ward 4 representative.
