OMB upholds appeal

The Ontario Municipal Board (OMB) has reversed a decision of the Halton land division committee which allowed a severance of 12 acres to a parcel of land along the Niagara Escarpment near Terra Cotta.

Halton Region appealed saying the application originally filed by Catharine Dillon for a severance on Lot 30, Conc. 10, and now applied for by Gall Dodokin is located within rural areas defined in interim planning policies of the region and is also located within a special policy area being studied by the Niagara Escarpment Commission.

The OMB hearing officer also noted that the Credit Valley Conservation Authority filed an objection and he also felt the severance was premature based on the plans for the area by the conservation authority.

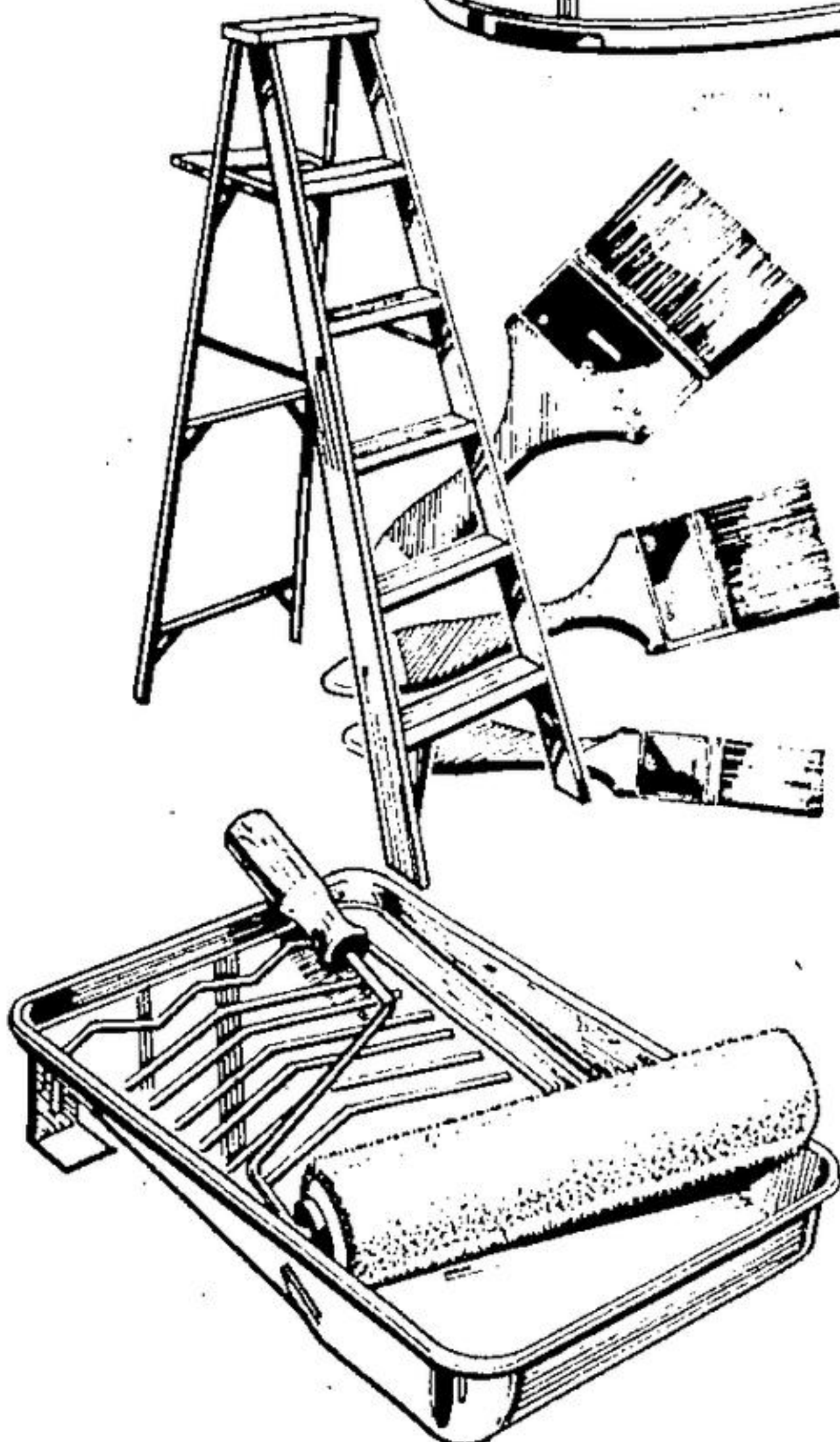

Here is what happened in the first 3 rounds:
Rd. 1 White
S. MacLeod 1-0 A. Boisvenue King's Gambit 33
B. MacLeod 0-1 B. Thompson King's Gambit 34
D. Nichols 1-0 G. Emerson Gruinfeld 41

Steve MacLeod converted a winning end game against Bo Boisvenue, while Brian MacLeod lost against accurate middle game play by Blair Thompson. Glen Emerson had a good position versus Dave Nichols, but time pressure caused his downfall.

Rd. 2
K. Neill 0-1 S. MacLeod Sicilian 55
C. Bertleson 0-1 B. MacLeod Queen's Gambit 41
G. Emerson 0-1 J. Moore Pirc Defence 50

Kevin Neill, after a bad opening, put up tough resistance against Steve MacLeod but was ground out in the ending. C. Bertleson sacrificed a piece in a promising position, but the move backfired and he lost to Brian MacLeod, while John Moore, won a 4 1/2 hour marathon against Glen Emerson.

B. Thompson 1-0 K. Neill French Defence 68
A. Boisvenue Caro-Kann 50
D. Nichols 1-0 C. Bertleson King's Indian 35

Blair Thompson scored his second point by adopting the Tarrasch variation against Kevin Neill's French Defence. Andre Boisvenue, lower rated than his opponent by some 350 points, played well to gain his first draw, while Dave Nichols won a rook against C. Bertleson.
