Numerous accidents result from storm

Winter weather with a vengeance that caused "total whiteouts" on Halton Hills roads and forced drivers to abandon their vehicles in deep ditches or snow banks, has kept Halton police working to investigate numerous accidents, many of them multiple collisions and markedby high damages.

A Halton police officer indicated to The Herald that the ntgn number of comisions had created a backlog in the police reports, Monday.

Trafalgar Road and Maple Avenue was the scene of a head-on collision that put both drivers into Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital for treatment of minor injures, Jan. 6 police said.


