



PREPARING FOR A CAREER

Twelve-year-old Mike Williams is getting an early start on a medical career. Last week the Grade 8 pupil at Centennial school who wants to be a doctor, demonstrated the anatomy of a frog compared to the human body in a series of dissections he carried out at the school's annual science fair. When the Herald photographer snapped his picture he was opening his third frog and still had a supply of about 10 more, which, he commented, would not likely be used. The science fair consisted of a series of displays by the school pupils and varied from experiments in making hydrogen to the effect of light on sound waves, properties of rising heat and the action of a volcano.

Agricultural Briefs

HALTON WHEAT PRODUCERS' ANNUAL
Charles Martin, Milton 1, was chosen as Committeeman from the Halton Wheat Producer's Association to the Ontario Wheat Producer's Marketing Board at the Halton annual meeting on February 17th in the Agricultural Office, Milton. Alternate Delegate is Joe Stutz, Milton 1.

Bruce Clark of Caledonia, a Director of the Ontario Board stated that 21,800,000 bushels of winter wheat had been purchased last year with 7,400,000 bushels sold for domestic use, 720,000 bushels for seed, 33,000 for feed, 9,600,000 for export, and 5,700,000 bushels still in storage. The world wheat market is depressed because of the high yields throughout the world last year. Russia had a 50 per cent increase in wheat production. The world market is currently close to the \$3.00 per bushel range. Last year the price received by Ontario farmers was \$3.68 per bushel.

This past fall there was a great increase of acreage planted to winter wheat in Ontario with a possible 30,000,000 bushels harvested this fall. Since February 1st all grains in Ontario are being sold on the metric basis. Mr. Clark stated that the University of Guelph are conducting research on varieties of winter wheat to try to control the excessive sprouting which occurred last year. Several farmers in Halton had to sell their sprouted wheat for feed rather than to the mill for higher prices.

HALTON-PEEL EGG PRODUCERS' ANNUAL
The Halton-Peel Egg Producers met for their annual meeting at the Golda Restaurant, Milton, on February 14th. It is some years since the last meeting of the Halton-Peel Egg Producers but an excellent turnout resulted from the initiative of the secretary, Mrs. Velma Ella. Stan Steen, the Director on the Ontario Egg Producer's Marketing Board from this zone and Jim Johnston, Chairman of the Board, were in attendance. A new quota transfer policy for egg producers is to be announced by their annual meeting on April 13th.
George E. Crompton of Markham, Chairman of the Retail Merchants Association of Canada, was guest speaker.
