OAHU The Gathering Place

Its capital, Honolulu, is a tropical metropolis with broad, modern thoroughfares, bright lights and soaring structures. Shower trees and palms line the boulevards, the scent of plumeria filters through the sunny air and Diamond Head stands watch over the long, lacy curve of Waikiki Beach.

Beyond the mist-laden mountains of the Koolau Range, break the finest surfing waves in the world, whilst fields of sugarcane bend gracefully beneath the gentle trade winds. Stop off at the Pali and admire the view.

MAUI The Valley Isle

With mountain foothills, enchanting vales, magic blue green panoramas, stretches of sun-drenched beach and sparkling waterfalls, Maui is one of the most splendid islands in the Pacific.

Discover the Iao Valley with its towering volcanic monolith. On the Western shore, there are long sweeping beaches of golden sand and secluded coves. Whilst in Lahaina, discover Hawaii's old capital, much of it restored as it was a century ago.

Maui's most spectacular sight, however is Haleakala, with its enormous moonlike crater soaring 10,000 feet into the Pacific sky.

The best marlin fishing in the world. Oahu vibrates with excitement. Its Honolulu and Waikiki Beach are truly legends. Kauai is the Garden Isle; Maui the Valley Isle. Their names alone conjure up memories you'll keep forever.

Just wait till you experience it all. The beaches, the surfing, the food and the nightlife. They're so very much in a class of their own. Won't you make this the summer you discovered the Islands?

Surrounded by breathtakingly beautiful waters that teem with life, edged with coral reefs and topped with fertile and luxuriant vegetation, these Pacific isles are an exotic dream.

Formerly known as the Sandwich Isles, Hawaii, Oahu, Maui, Kauai and their numerous out-islands nestle under the Tropic of Cancer. This accounts much for the languorous and serene way of life on these unique, gentle islands. Where centuries of pounding surf have granulated the sands to sugar-like fineness. Isles of scenic splendour, home of a verdant 1800-acre rain forest and the Fern Grotto where, incredibly, the ferns grow upside down, and botanical gardens feature the flowers and foliage of Polynesia.

There is much to dazzle the eye. Hawaii can boast of the Kilauea Volcano whose crater is ringed with rich green trees. Oahu has Honolulu and Waikiki Beach, famous the world over. Maui entices countless visitors to its historic Lahaina Waterfront, its Mt. Haleakala and Iao Valley while Kauai keeps them coming back with Waimea Canyon, "The Grand Canyon of the Pacific" Olu Pua Gardens and the Spouting Horn.

Temperatures in the fall and winter will range from 18 degrees C to high 20 degrees C (66 degrees F to 82 degrees F) with gentle winds wafting in from the Pacific Ocean.

Clothing should be light and easy-care. Ladies can wear dresses and pant suits just about anywhere and a sports jacket is recommended for gentlemen. Street wear can be casual, though bathing suits in the streets are not permitted. Currency is the American dollar and it is recommended that visitors change their money for U.S. Currency before arrival on the isles.

Entering the country requires only proof of Canadian citizenship.

Banking is from 9 a.m. - 3 p.m. Monday to Saturday and open on Sunday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Shopping can be done 7 days a week and opening and closing hours will vary from very early to very late.
