Defensively, Rebels were led by Paul Krowchuk who had four rebounds and four steals and Grady Lenski with three rebounds. Doug Lamb's continued hard work emulated the way Rebels played and resulted in several steals. Also, rookie Mike McMenemy played well in substitution.

Rebel shooting accuracy was slightly better than 50 per cent although turnovers were a downfall (24), a statistic Coach Costigan attributed to pressure.

Six foot six centre Leon Byrnes and talented Derrick Lewis led the Oakwood squad with 14 points apiece in what was indeed a well executed exhibition of basketball at its best.

Oakwood started quickly at the outset only to have Georgetown counter in short order and carry the play. Cheered on by a large crowd the Rebels took a 18-13 first quarter lead and trailed by a single point 29-28 at the half.
