TOURNAMENT RULES

- 1. Play will be governed by Ontario Minor Hockey Association rules and tournament sanction with the following provisions.
- 2. The tournament will be conducted on an elimination basis. Competing teams drawn against one another will play two games, total goals for the right to advance to the next round.
- 3. In the event of ties on the round, an overtime, five minute stop time period shall be played with the first goal or shots on goal deciding the winner if no goal is scored. 4. The game clock will be stopped in the event of injury,
- at the referee's discretion. 5. Sixteen players shall be allowed to dress for each
- game, plus a spare goaler who shall play only in goal. 6. Every skater must be equipped to the referee's satisfaction. Helmets with chin straps fastened proper skate heel guards are both a must. Goaltenders must also

wear face masks,

- 7. Each competing team may supply a man to act in the timekeeper's box if so desired.
- B. All tournament games will be on a 3 ten-minute stop time period basis.
- 9. If a tie exists at the end of regulations time in the Grand Championship game, ten minute overtime periods shall be played with the teams changing ends every ten minutes, until the first goal is scored, breaking the tie and deciding the winner.

ATTENTION: As tournament is OMHA sanctioned be hereby warned that unnecessary rough hockey in tournament will not be tolerated. Match penalties, along with referee's written report shall be forwarded immediately to the office of the OMHA Secretary. Player is simultaneously suspended for balance of the tournament and cannot take part in any OMHA organized hockey until his case has been reviewed by the OMHA.

Harry Levy deserves thanks

The 1977 Georgetown International Bantam Tournament will mark the first time in 11 year's that the tourney's chairman position has not been held by Mr. Harry Levy. Mr. Levy, a former Councillor for the Corporation of the Town of Halton Hills decided last year to work merely in an advisory capacity and handed over the chairman's position to Mr. Paul Milne, a young man who has worked with Levy, for the past several years, in the organizing of the event.

Harry has not completely removed himself from an active role in the tournament however, as he is the event's Treasurer and will be on hand, personally, during the running of the tournament in order to assure it's smooth operation.

Mr. Levy had been involved with the tournament since it's inception, in 1961, but at the request of Red Asseltine, in 1967, the Georgetown Kinsmen Club took over the organizational aspect and Harry accepted the Chairman's position.

Asked why he became so involved with the tournament, Mr. Levy explained that it was basically because of the organizational challenge. It should be noted that very few men would be likely to take up the challenge, if they knew the amount of work involved.

The tournament, under Mr. Levy's direction, has been praised as the "most highly organized administrative tournament in Canada" and teams that have competed here have regularly endorsed this statement.

Although he has never played the game, apart from the old shinny game, Mr. Levy's dedication to this tournament accurately expresses his love for the game and for the youngsters who compete.

Georgetown minor hockey in particuluar and minor hockey in general, owe Harry Levy, a debt of gratitude. He has unselfishly given of himself to help promote the sport and his contribution will have a lasting effect on anyone who has ever been connected with the tourna-

Although Harry has relingished the Chairman's position, the organization he leaves will no doubt be used as a showcase in the staging of other tournaments throughout the minor hockey system.
