Region action invalid, illegal, lawyer claims

Two resolutions calling for the establishment of Site F as a central waste disposal location; and for Halton Region to take options on about 250 acres of land in the Tremaine-Britannia Road area, maybe illegal, an environmental lawyer has cautioned council.

David Estrin, representing the Tremaine-Britannia Citizens Group, said in a letter to region chairman Ric Morrow that both resolutions passed March 2 are invalid and illegal.

He says the region does not have the power to take options on the land or to seek site approvals from the environ-

mental assessment board. Council, Mr. Estrin claims, is in violation of a section of the Planning Act which requires council to first rezone the land and amend official plans accordingly.

The citizens group has given authorization he said, for court action seeking a restraining order permanently ruling out the possibility of the region, or any individual, using the Site F lands for a waste disposal dump.

He urged the region to seek alternatives since legal procedures and necessary approvals could drag the matter out for five or six years. Regional

council heard three weeks ago that capacity at the existing three waste disposal sites is due to run out within 18 months.

Engineering consultants agreed that necessary environmental and other approvals could take as much as 35 months.

Regional council last week took no public action on the charges, but is expected to reply shortly.

He said it is solely a matter of legal right of the residents affected by the recent council decision and the right of the region "to respect their rights as well as planning laws."
