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
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

The bridal white tradition has evolved gradually through the centuries, and although the style of diamond engagement ring, wedding gown and bouquet has changed to suit the age, the white color still reigns sup-

The white diamond has been associated with remance since early Greek times. In fact, the very word diamond comes from the Greek 'adamas" meaning unconquerable. The Greeks believed that the fire in a white diamond reflected the constant flame of love.

The first white diamond on record as an engagement ring dates only to 1477 when Maximilian of Austria asked Mary of Burgundy to be his

Max was a little shy about popping the question, so he consulted with an advisor who told him: "Your Grace must have a ring set with a diamond," Max did give Mary a sparkling white diamond, and a tradition was

Until the end of the nineteenth century, however, the dramond tradition was reserved only for the royal and the wealthy because of the rarity of diamonds. Then, diamonds were discovered in quantity in South Africa and a white diamond for the engagement rapidly became a bridal tradition most could

Today four-out-of-five brides in the United States walk down the aisle with a lovely white diamond on the fourth (inger left hand

Why are bridal gowns white? According to fashion history, at one time wedding gowns ran the gamut of colors: blues, pinks, yellows and even red! Then, in 1799 Nellie Custis started a trend by choosing a white silk gown for her wedding to George Washington's favorite nep-

By 1818, white gowns were so popular that white became the traditional bridal color.

The white bridal headpiece also can be credited to Miss Custis. She drew a pair of lace curtains around her head as she spoke to her finance through an open window one day. When he said she never looked prettier, she decided to wear a white lace head searf for her wed-

Although flowers have been used at weddings since ancient times, the white bouquet can be traced to 1830 when orange blossoms became the vogue in southern France, Orange blossoms were considered the flower of fertility and happiness, since

the orange tree blossoms and bears fruit at the same time In later times, white roses for love and lilies for purity also became popular for bri-

dal bauquets. As for other bridal white traditions, throwing white rice at the newlyweds symbolized wealth and health. In the Orient, it means "may you have a full pantry." But in ancient times, rice was thrown as food for jealous evil spirit who hovered near the bride and groom.

The white wedding cake dates to ancient Rome, where a cake made of flour. salt and water was broken

Groom Is Also There

When it comes to a wedding, it's tradition that the bride is star of the show. No one notices the bridegroom unless he happens to forget the rings.

But weddings are changing. Not only are ceremonies simpler and music lighter. but according to the Men's Fashion Association, the new male formal wear allows the bridegroom to share some of the spotlight on the wedding

Today there is a definite trend towards new styling in wedding attire for men. The young "about to be marrieds" are picking it up quickly. It is one way they can add a new and modern touch to their wedding without violating any established traditions...

The new look for the bridegroom is elegant and regal. It is based on the Prince Albert coat, which was popular at the start of the twentieth century. The dinner jacket is extra long, high-buttoning, and features a spare cut bottom. It is extremely shaped so the prospective bridgegroom would do well to stay trim for his wedding day.

For a daytime wedding the jacket is gray. For a wedding in the evening, its black Both jackets feature velvet collars and lapels edged in braid.

With the daytime jacket the bridegroom wears gray striped trousers, a wing collar shirt and striped tie. For evening black trousers match the jacket and the bridegroom wears a formal shirt with a bow tie.

Otherwise, weddings still are governed by rules. If the bridegroom prefers the standard wedding attire, he should remember that his outfit is determined by the bride's gown and the time of day for the ceremony.

If it's going to be a daytime semi-formal wedding (which means it's only somewhat less than formal), he should wear a short black or oxford gray "stroller". He wears it with either a white shirt and tie of subdued pattern - usually a gray moire stripe or a small black and white check.

For an evening semi-formal wedding, the bridegroom has a choice of either white or black dinner jacket, perhaps with satin faced lapels. For this occasion, he should forego the colorful evening shirts, cumberbunds and accessories which are currently popular, but are considered too informal for a wedding ceremony.

If the bride wants a formal evening wedding, the bridegroom wears the ultimate in formal wear-A tailcoat wih a white formal waist coat His trousers will match the tailcoat, and he'll wear a wing collar shirt with a white formal bow tie.

For informal wedding ceremonies, the bridegroom has several outfits from which to choose. First is a dark business suit complemented with a white shirt, a tie of restrained color and pattern, and black shoes. If you are buying a new suit for the big ocasion, remember that today's suits feature long jackets and often feature fancy pocket treatments. Also acceptable for infor-

mal weddings, particularly if they are garden weddings, or ceremonies held in the country, are navy blue or black blazers worn with white or very light gray stacks, Blazers can be woven or in one of the new knits. Again, the shirt should be white and tie subdued.

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
