The Norval Alouettes claimed their third consecutive, Georgetown Industrial Hockey League Championship and the Molson's award that is emblamatic of league supremacy when the blanked Thompson's Construction, 3-0 last Sunday. The Alouettes swept the best-of-five championship series in three straight games.

They are worthy champions, but the league itself is suffering because the other member teams just can't compete, over the long run, with the Alouettes. The rest of the league, if they hope to be competive in the 1977-78 season, should start recruiting immediately.






