Jobs available

Kay Richardson, superintendent of Manpower Operations feels the unemployment situation in Georgetown and Brampton will soon pick up. "Georgetown is in an unfortunate situation since the closing of Domtar Fine Papers

but hopefully things will pick up in the future," Mrs. Richardson said.

She recommended unemployed people in Georgetown apply for jobs in the Brampton, Bramalea area, since the number of positions available are increasing in the Brampton area.

Mrs. Richardson felt the 7,000 figure Buzz Hargrove, spokesman for the Brampton and District Labor Council quoted to members of the Halton Hills Concerned Citizen's Action Committee last week representing the people unemployed in the area was "not technically true." She feels he may have included figures for Malton.

ARC open house

The Adult Rehabilitation Centre (ARC) at Hornby celebrated its 11th anniversary with an Open House last Thursday evening. There are 31 trainees and a staff of three at the old Hornby school converted into a workshop for the mentally retarded adults of North Halton.

ARC workshop director, Winifred Isham, says the group hopes soon to open a store where the ceramics made at ARC can be sold. "We've been waiting six months now for word from the ministry of community and social services," she said.

Just when it will begin and where it will be located is still unknown although Mrs. Isham says it will be "somewhere in North Halton" depending on what suitable location can be found.

When the store opens it will be staffed by ARC trainees.

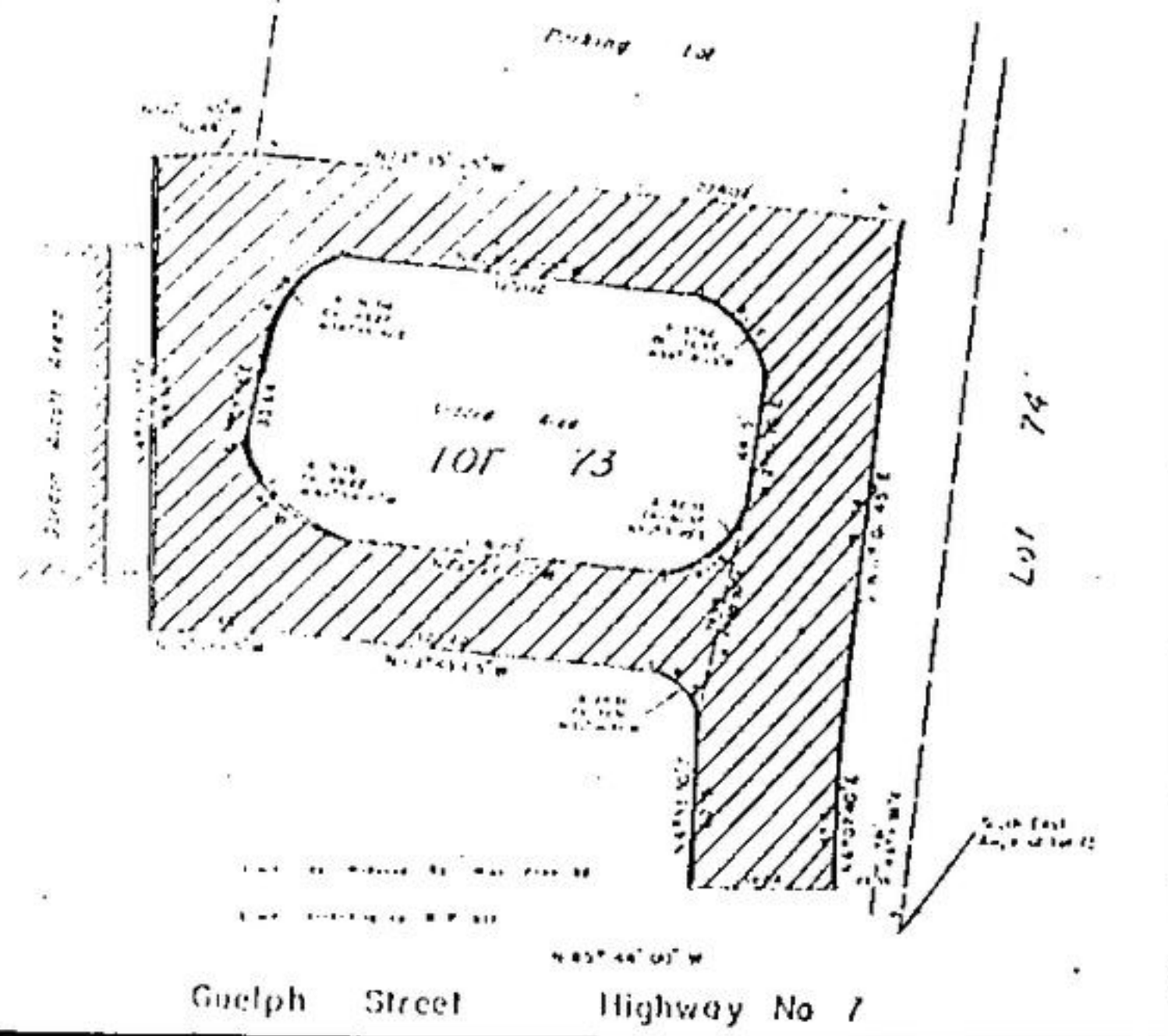
TOWN OF HALTON HILLS Recreation Department. RESTRICTED PARKING AT THE GORDON ALCOTT MEMORIAL ARENA

By-Law 77-6

All persons using or visiting the Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena, please be aware of the Restricted Parking Areas, as all vehicles in this Area can be "Ticketed" by the Police Department and if necessary Towed away.

A certified copy of By-Law 77-6 may be seen at the Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena, or, at the Town of Halton Hills offices during regular working hours.

The plan below shows the Restricted Area.

Ontario has a plan to make it easier.

AHOP/HOME (Assisted Home Ownership Program/ Home Ownership Made Easy Plan) is a federal-provincial program designed to bring home ownership within the reach of moderate and lower income families by offering financial aid in the form of loans, subsidies and grants. How much aid you receive depends upon your household formation, income and the monthly carrying charges for your new home.

All types of new houses are eligible for assistance as long as they are AHOP qualified by Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation and are sold within the maximum AHOP prices in your municipality.

Through an AHOP Interest Reduction Loan, the first year's mortgage payments are reduced to an 8% interest rate. An AHOP subsidy of up to \$750 is available during the first year of occupancy so you would not spend more than 25% of your household income on mortgage payments and municipal taxes. You may also qualify for a Provincial HOME Grant of up to \$750 in the first year should your mortgage

and tax payments still exceed 30% of your household income. Subsidies and grants are not repayable. Loan repayments begin in the seventh year of the mortgage.

If you are interested in buying a home under the AHOP/HOME Program, look in the real estate section of your newspaper for participating builders.
