Glen O'Connor, son of Mr. and Mrs. A.B. O'Connor of Terra Cotta has been selected to represent the Georgetown Rotary Club on the "Adventure in Citizenship" program sponsored annually by the Ottawa Rotary Club.

The Grade 13 student at Georgetown district high school is one of several students across the country selected for the program based on "outstanding achievements In their own communities".

Since the program started more than 26 years ago almost 6,300 students from across Canada have taken part in the program which offers them a chance to see Parliament national centres for arts and sciences and to meet government; diplomatic and professional leaders.

"For more than a quarter of a century," Gerry Peace, Georgetown Rotary Club President said, "the project, supported by Rotary Clubs across Canada, has made a very important contribution to the principles of Canadian unity and true Canadian citizenship."

The jacket was trimmed with a rib knlt vand at the bottom, cuffs, and on the vertical slash pockets. She also made a silver grey boucle skirt and top with dark blue trim and a hooded cape in an Indian pattern of rust, light brown, beige and white for a knit


