Unique toy shop opens caters to local crafts

Designers of home-made children's toys now have an outlet to sell their crafts in Georgetown.

Marion Manning, manager of the new retail store Toy Magic, chooses from samples of the persons work, which toys she will carry and sell on consignment.

Mrs. Manning has received already 30 phone calls from

local people.

One complete shelf section of the store is filled with home-made dolls, animals, wooden toys and a wooden rocking horse, representing the work by about 12 people.

Mrs. Manning is aware of the problems "mother" faces when she takes her children shopping and has enclosed a little play area for children

with a picket fence in the front half of the store.

Before buying any stock Mrs. Manning inspects the items closely in an attempt to purchase only unbreakable toys.

The store offers a balanced stock ranging from toys to books and is located on the corner of Mountainview Road and Guelph Street.

Region rejects free land

Halton Region administration committee has rejected a proposal from a Milton resident that he sell for \$1 \$12 acres of land for the construction of a new regional headquarters.

Today council is expected to approve a tender for the construction of a new headquarters at a site adjacent to the Ontario sports centre on Bronte Road at the Queen Elizabeth Way, Oakville.

Committee members felt the proposal from Joseph Willmott for the land at Derry Road and Highway 25 has come too late for any action to be taken. Architectural planning for the Oakville site is completed and tenders have been called.

Milton Mayor Don Gordon, however, in making the offer

on Mr. Willmott's behalf said "council still has the opportunity to review another location without undue delay and further cost."

Mayor Gordon said the Willmott's have been residents of Halton for 150 years and are reknown for their public service and wish to make the property a gift to the region.

He said the land is situated at the geographical centre of the region near a developing mall with servicing readily available.

"The one complaint that is often heard about this location (meaning the town of Milton, the former county seat) is its distance from the majority of regional councillors," Mayor Gordon says. "When discuss-

ing such a central location, distance becomes irrelevant, besides, it's never too far to visit a friend-Milton."

Regional council will review the committee recommendation today.

The first prize cushion tops in all the classes will be entered for competition at the area convention to be held at the Royal York on November 9th and 10th.

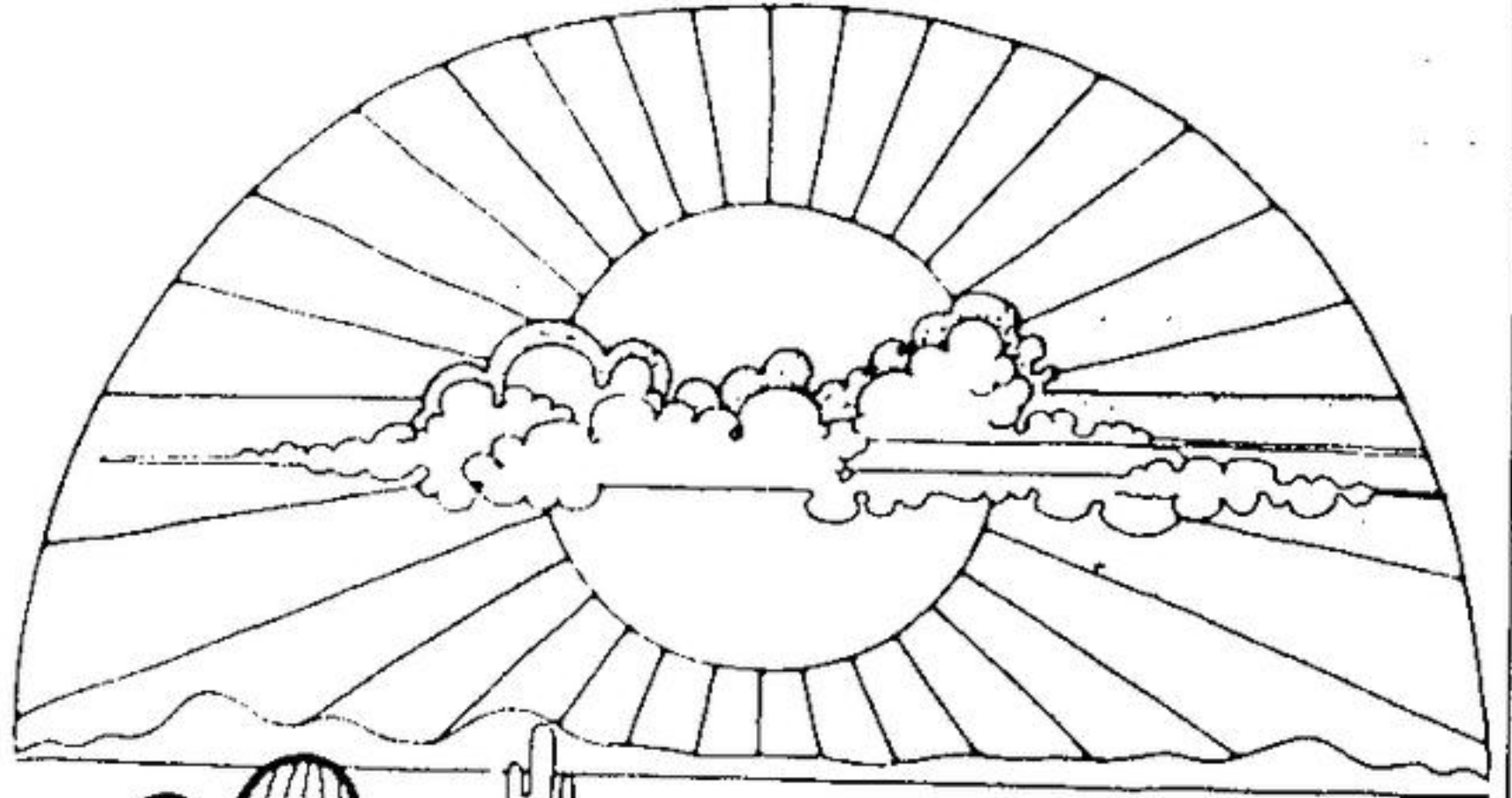
In the 1978 the District Annual will be hosted by the Coronation Branch of Bolton, and the Carol Service location will be decided at the Fall Board meeting.
