## Landfill accident settled

A Feb. 11 incident in which a private car was pushed by a bulldozer at the Georgetown landfill site "was blown out of proportion", the contractor told the Halton public works committee last week.

William Menary, whose Branford contracting company has the contract for operations at the site, said a \$1,500 settlement has been arrived at with David Lawrence owner of the 1966 model car involved in the incident.

Mr. Menary speaking before the committee to answer concerns raised by Halton Hills councillors over the Site's operation said the employee involved in the incident has since left the company.

He said, that in some cases there's justification on the part of employees for their attitude because "a few-very few (residents and private individuals) seem to have a grip against regional government and do not hesitate to give vent to their feelings" against the

operator who is not a regional employee.

Coun. Roy Booth called the February incident the "straw that broke the camel's back" and highlighted a situation which has existed for over three years.

Mr. Booth charged that many complaints have been made about abusive language and attitudes. He said on one occasion a small girl was in a car when such an incident occurred.

Committee chairman Jack Rafis agreed that private vehicles on the site of any landfill operation move about "like a bunch of rabbits" interrupting the operation.

But Coun. Russ Miller called the Lawrence incident "damned serious" and admonished the contractor for the delay in settlement and inconvenience caused to Mr. Lawrence.

Mr. Menary replied that had no solicitor been involved in the settlement, the settlement would have been completed

sooner. He said he was impowered by his insurance company to offer a rental vehicle pending settlement and to make a cash settlement immediately.

Instead he told the committee a settlement offer was proposed by Mr. Lawrence, withdrawn and then a solicitor engaged which delayed the action.

Mr. Menary said in answer to concerns over signs stating "enter at own risk" that it is a requirement for legal and insurance purposes. Coun. Booth had said he expected to "see a skull and cross bones painted on the sign."

The site is open to private individuals at their own risk but boxes are available for the disposal of refuse which can be hauled onto the site, Mr. Menary said.

He added that any problems with payment of overweight fees for residents would be passed onto the region for settlement if an argument issues.

### THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF HALTON HILLS Amendment to By-law 74 - 51 by By-law 76 - 95 EXPLANATORY NOTE

Council for The Corporation of the Town of Halton Hills deems it advisable to amend by-law 74-51 (the comprehensive zoning by-law for the former Township of Esquering area) to provide for those items in by-law 74-51 which were not finally determined by the Ontario Municipal Board at the Hearing held on the comprehensive zoning by-law commencing the 15th day of March, 1976.

At the time of the Ontario Municipal Board Hearing in March of 1976, a number of representations were made by or on behalf of various individuals owning properties that would be affected by by-law 74-51. Most of the comments received by objectors related to specific properties where, for instance, a commercial use had been carried out on the property for a number of years prior to the date of the passing of the comprehensive zoning by-law, but through an oversight the land had been designated Rural or some other zone classification on the land use schedule. In the decision of the Ontario Municipal Board dated the 5th day of April, 1976 on the comprehensive zoning by-law the approval or rejection of those parts of the by-law where land had been inadvertently designated other than the existing use was simply delayed to be covered in an amending by-law.

By-law 76-95, and in particular, sections 10, 12, 14, 18, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, and 25, deal with specific properties where a zone change from the original designation in by-law 74-51 was deemed necessary.

Sections 11, 13, 15, 17 and 19 in By-law 76-95 redesignate parcels of land shown on Schedule "B" to by-law 74-51 from Niagara Escarpment (E zone), to Rural (RU) zone since after by-law 74-51 was passed by Council, but before the Ontario Municipal Board Hearing in March of 1976, the new Niagara Escarpment Development Control Area was defined and at that time it was determined that these particular parcels of land did not fall within the Development Control Area.

Another major area of by-law 74-51 was not covered in the original Board decision of April 5th, 1976 and relates to the OS1 and OS2 zones. These zones are known as open space and hazard lands. With the new mapping available from the Ministry of Natural Resources the original OS1 and OS2 zones as shown on by-law 74-51 were deleted and the zones as outlined on Schedules "B", "C", "D", and "E" to By-law 76-95 are to be substituted, as outlined in Section 9.

Section 6 to by-law 76-95 deals with lands owned by Upper Canada College and known as Lots 12, 13, 14 and 15 in Concession 11 for the former Township of Esquering and provides that these lands may be used for the uses historically carried out on the properties by Upper Canada College.

Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, to By-law 76-95 deal with general amendments to by-law 74-51. In some instances errors that were originally made in by-law 74-51 are corrected and in others general amendments to the by-law are made in accordance with portions of the decision of the Ontario Municipal Board on by-law 74-51 on the 5th day of April, 1976.

The Notice of Hearing published with this Explanatory Note sets out the time, place, and date when the Ontario Municipal Board will consider the application of the Town of Halton Hills for approval of by-law 76-95.

## Wintario grant structure explained in local seminar

About 20 recreation-oriented people Thursday sought answers on how to receive Wintario grants.

"The program is very flexible so there are no concrete rules," said Pat Duffy, Wintario project consultant. "Since grant money depends on the profits from tickets sold."

Generally, if the groups meets these six recommendations their grant will be accepted.

Wintario funds are only allotted for projects in physical fitness, sports, recreation or cultural activities.

grants are available in response to community supported initiatives raised by private contributions of monies, efforts and other resources.

projects funded by Wintario must be able to sustain any future on-going costs without any further reliance on Wintario.

projects must benefit the community and made available to the public

funds are not available to substitute, relieve, or replace regular government programs

in this field of financial resource.

"Any group interested should first contact the Hamilton office to explain the project, and then make a formal application," Duffy said.

Wintario usually pays 50 per cent for non-capital projects, and for capital one-third of the cost.

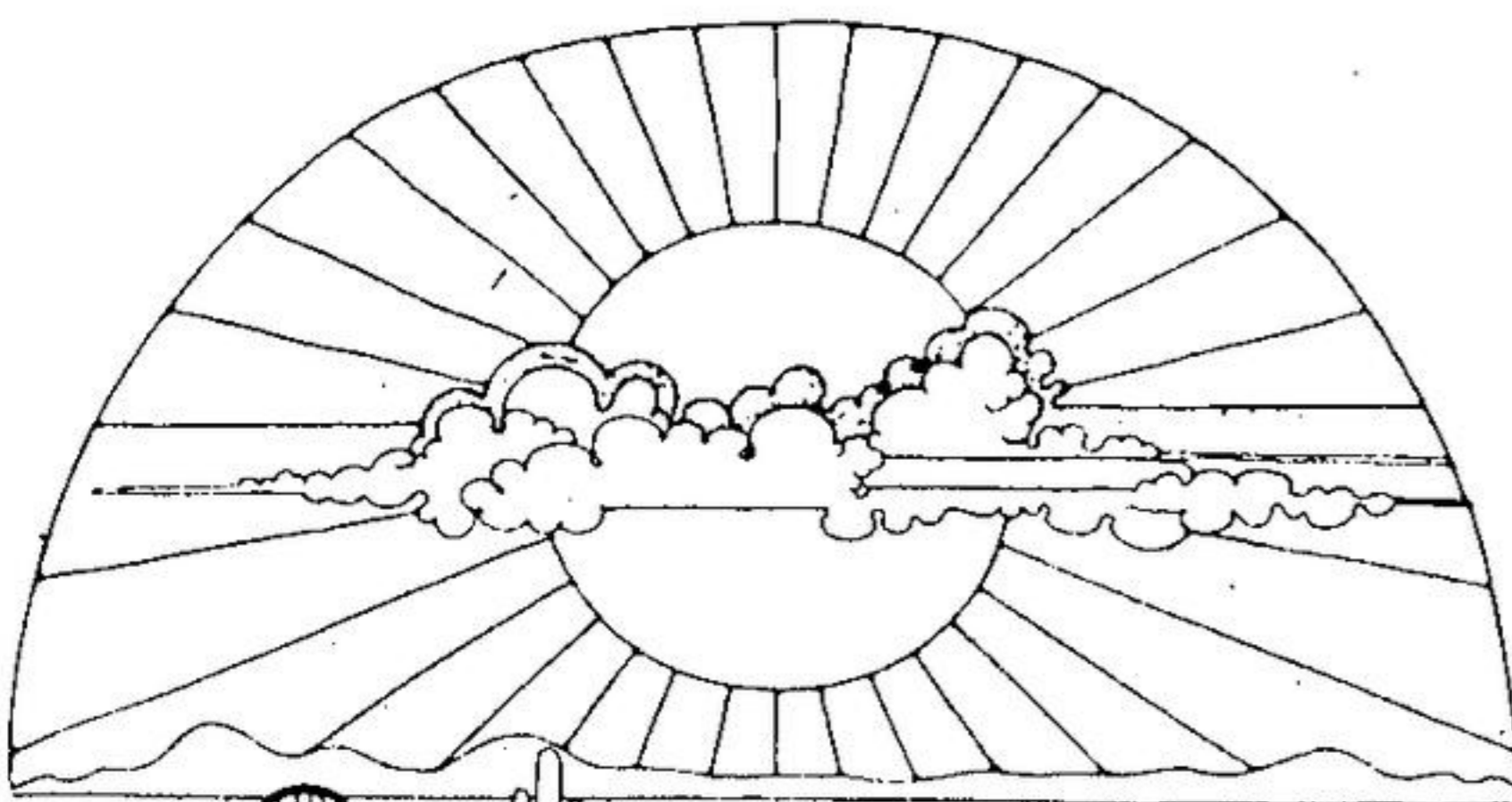
Mr. Duffy is busy travelling about four nights a week to municipalities to answer similar questions and feels the program is working well.

"We're distributing money around, to worthwhile causes," he said.
