Despite an astounding three goal performance from centre-half Gord Miller, the Rebs were unable to stave off elimination when they failed to connect for the tying marker.

The loss brought to an end a season of transition for the Seniors who started with a four game undefeated streak only to falter towards the latter stages of the campaign.

Nevertheless, the team still managed a respectable four win, two loss, two tie record in a highly competitive Halton League. While they could not compare with the 1976 squad which won the Haltons, several players did show improvement.

As well, the defensive aspect of the team's game became prominent, although at the expense of its offensive capabilities.

In Coach Jack Brown's words "We didn't score on our opportunities like we should have. In several games we hit goalposts four or five times. With a few breaks we could have gone a lot farther than we did."

As for next year Brown's optimistic and looks for big efforts from several returnees. Prominent in his plans is Miller who has been a key man for the team this season according to veteran left wing Paul Beer.

The Seniors will lose eight players before next season including Murray Morvac, Mike Hastings, Gary Richardson, Scott McLaughlin, Ken Flynn, Jim Lindsay, Glen Bodnar and Paul Beer all of whom graduate.
