

### Install catchbasin

Works committee refused Richard Nowina's plea Monday to solve his drainage problem by installing a catch basin.

Coun. George Maltby's recommendation at last meeting to construct a catch basin in front of the Glen Williams town hall and connect it to the regional storm sewer was lost in a 3-2 vote which Chairman Mike Armstrong said should be recorded in the minutes. Deputy town engineer Ted

Ballinger said a catch basin would cost \$1,350 and the region reported a catch basin could be hooked into a storm sewer only in emergency situations.

He said the drainage problem could be solved by constructing a \$75 asphalt swail and the recommendation will be discussed at Council Monday.

Mr. Nowina said he will appear at council Monday to appeal the catch basin solution.

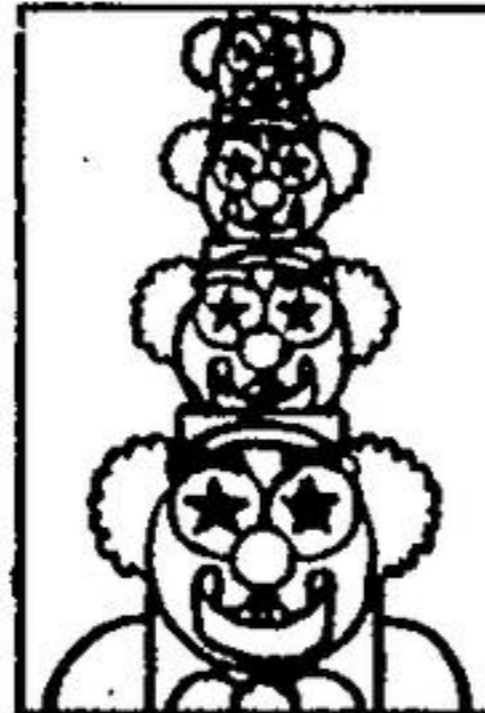

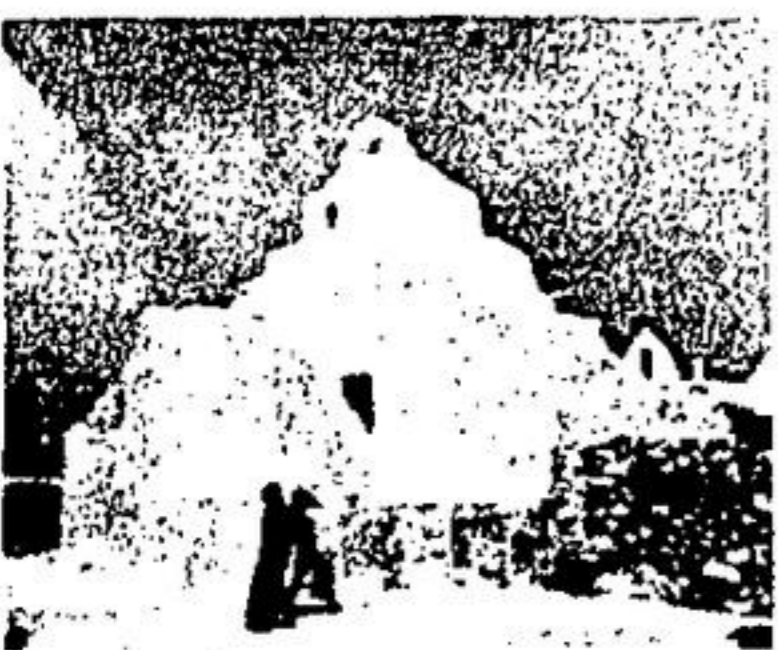

# Travel GREECE



Greece is not merely the Parthenon and Poseidon's Temple - although these incomparable monuments to man are arresting enchantment. The whole country is alive with vacation enchantment. The cafes, markets and bazars of Athens are abuzz with the business of living, while beyond, the land of Classical Greece awaits with ancient names to tease your memory.

Then to the Aegean, possibly the world's most enchanting sea, aboard fabulous cruise ships. Visit the Greek Isles for exotic evenings ashore or gala parties aboard. Your own personal odyssey, the world the Greeks have for it.

Variety of scenery is the essence of Greece. From the rugged, mountainous northern borderline to its pastoral southern shores, from the Ionian Islands in the west to Crete and the Dodecanese, from the lordly peaks of Mt. Olympus to the beaches of the Cyclades you will find a country bathed in a clear and luminous light. Everywhere the deep, rich veins of Greek history,

tradition and legend await you. A country pulsating with life, a country known for the humanity, warm-heartedness and cheerfulness of its inhabitants, where modern technology has not managed to make man a slave to machinery and where individual service is still the byword.

Come to Greece there is so much to see and do wherever you travel in Greece every day is sure to be an adventure, a revelation of a way of life. From the sophisticated atmosphere of Rhodes, Corfu and Athens to the tiny villages, from the plains to the islands, from the sandy beaches to the mountains, you will be greeted with a warm and glowing hospitality and will see the ancient and modern civilizations side by side.

#### ATHENS

The then Royal Palace is now the Parliament Building which stands on a small hill overlooking the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier and Constitution Square. Visit the National Archaeological Museum, where your guide will explain briefly the development of ancient Greece. On then to the Acropolis, the hill on which Athens was founded. Here you will see the beautiful Temple of Wingless Victory and the Parthenon. Both buildings were originally dedicated to the goddess Athena from whom Athens takes its name. As you stand in the Parthenon looking out over Piraeus to the Saronic Bay, it is easy to imagine that this was the centre of civilization some two thousand four hundred years ago. The balance of the day is at leisure. Dinner at the hotel.

#### CORINTH—MYCENAE—EPIDAUROS—NAUPLIA "Classical" tour of Greece.

From Athens travel to the Corinth Canal. The canal was originally started by the Roman emperor Nero in the 1st Century B.C., but the actual canal was not dug until the 1880's. Nearby stands Ancient Corinth, which once dominated the main trade routes since it controlled both the Corinth and Saronic Gulf. The city was a wealthy commercial and maritime power even one thousand years before Christ. Nearby is Mycenae, the centre of a flourishing civilization over three thousand years ago. Here you will see the imposing Cyclopean Wall, made of stones so massive that according to legend the Cyclopes helped to build it.

Some twenty miles away is Epidaurus-sanctuary of Aesclepius, the God of Healing. Every summer a festival of ancient Greek plays is held here in the original theatre-one of the most acoustically perfect in the world. Overnight accommodation is provided at Nauplia-an attractive seaside resort which was originally the port for Mycenae.

#### OLYMPIA

In Classical Greece this was the most important sanctuary of Zeus, although its origins go back much further. The Olympic Games were officially instituted in

776 B.C., which marks the beginning of recorded history in Greece. During the Games an international truce was declared so that

competitors from all over Greece could take part. Today, you can see the remains of the colossal Temple of Zeus, the treasure houses and gymnasium as well as parts of the original stadium.

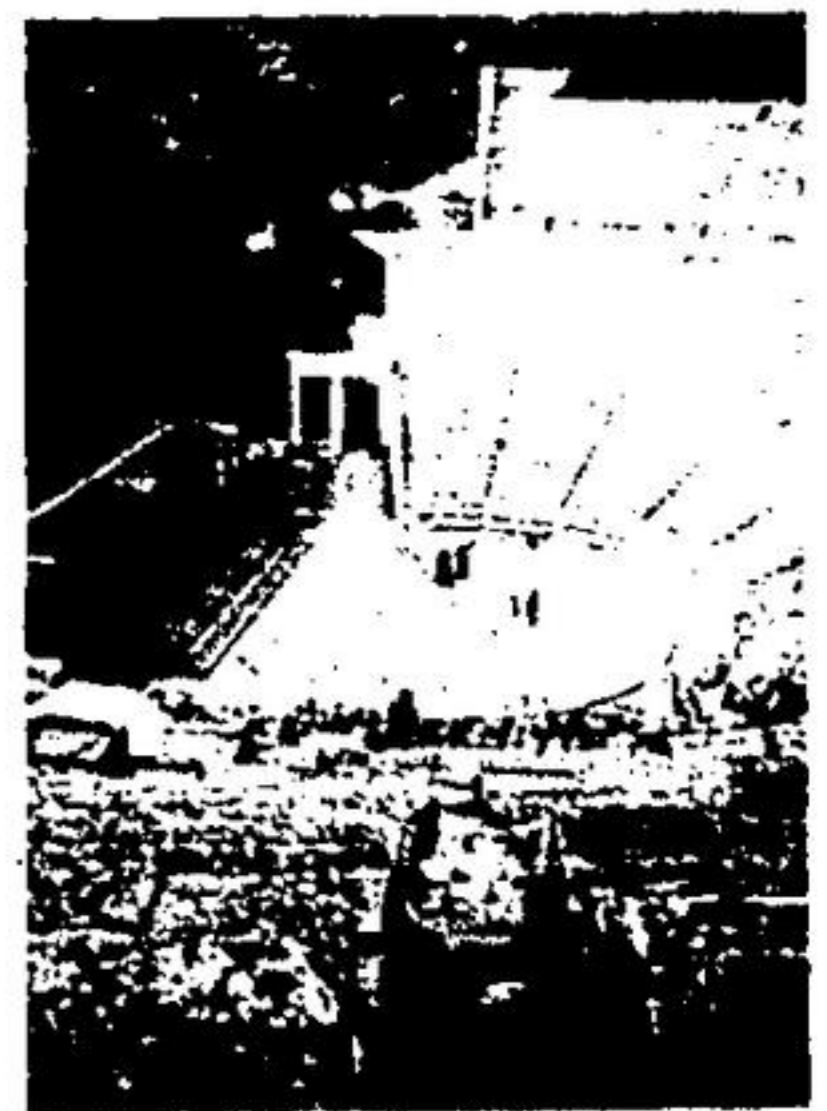
#### DELPHI

The town of Delphi is set on the southern foothills of Mt. Parnassus. Two thousand five hundred years ago the mysterious prophecies of the Oracle of Delphi were sought by statesmen and commoners alike. The High Priestess Pythia was consulted on personal and private matters as well as on affairs of state. On the whole the prophecies were non-committal and ambiguous, but occasionally managed to be strikingly accurate.

Delphi reached the peak of its influence and fame in the 7th Century B.C., when the Greek empire extended from Asia to Italy.

#### CORFU

Poets have chosen Corfu as a setting for their most idyllic love stories: Homer making it the kingdom of Alcinoos, whose daughter Nausicaa inspired a greater love in Odysseus than the sorceress Circe with all her wiles. Shakespeare placing there Prospero's Cell in the Tempest. Neither had visited the island, but the fame of its natural charm filled the dawn of literature, spread to Shakespearean England, and by the time the Empress Elizabeth of Austria paid her first visit, graceful monuments and buildings added new lustre to the superb contrast of the luxuriant vegetation around the multi-coloured fine old villages against the dramatic background of the stark mainland mountains.
