The success of the fishing trip will be determined by the weather as will the picnic. So again fingers are crossed.

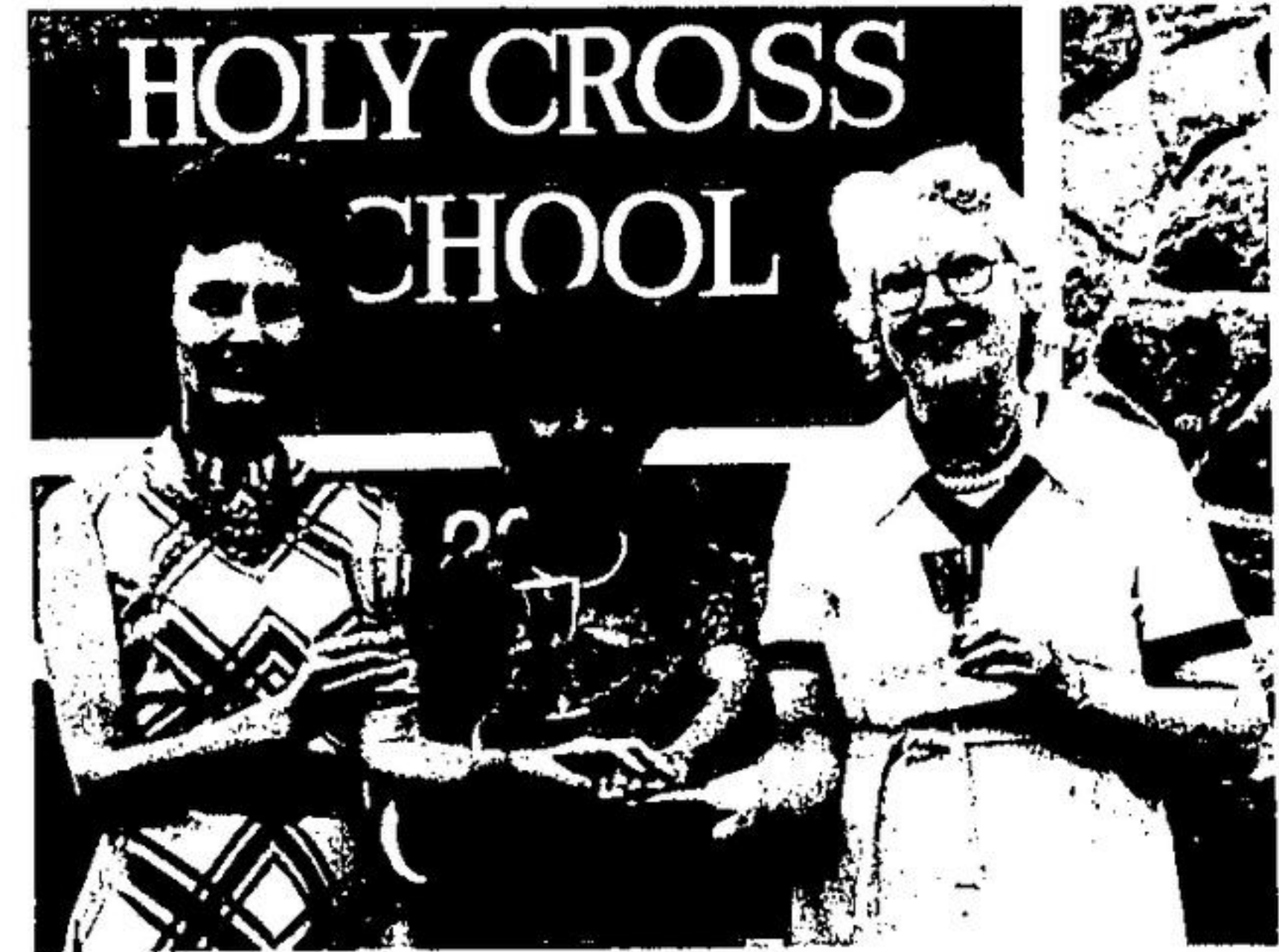
