

## Three new courses at Sheridan

Sheridan College will introduce three new programs to its Brampton Campus this fall, taking advantage of increased space and improved facilities there.

Only one of the programs has not been offered before; the other two have previously been run at the Oakville Campus but are now being made available for the first time in Brampton.

The totally new offering is Motor Carrier Administration, a one-year diploma program designed to help meet the growing need for well-trained management in the trucking industry.

Developed in co-operation with the Ontario Trucking Association, it is the first full-time program in truck transportation available in this province.

The program is open to anyone who has completed at least one year of post-secondary education, preferably including one or more business courses.

Students will receive extensive training in the standard business disciplines, as well as six key areas of motor carrier operation - administration, transport regulations, marketing, equipment and operations, tariffs and costing, and transportation labor relations.

Sheridan's two-year Correctional Worker program, previously offered in Oakville, will now be offered only in Brampton beginning this fall.

This program prepares students for careers in the rehabilitation of adults charged or convicted of lawbreaking in Ontario.

Following a common Human Studies semester concentrating on the behavioral sciences and administrative skills, stu-

dents examine the justice system in Ontario and Canada, explore contemporary methods of rehabilitation, and discover the resources available to serve the adult offender.

Classroom experience is supplemented by field observation and work placement in a variety of correctional settings. Security and Law Enforcement courses.

All races are over a distance of 150 yards (140 metres) with the exception of the Featherweight class for dogs under 5 pounds, who will race 100 yards. Boats and carsmen are supplied by the CNE without charge. ## Free dog swim at CNE open to all dogs

The Canadian National Exhibition DOG SWIM - the largest organized event of its kind in the world - will be the highlight of the CNE waterfront on Sunday, August 21.

This 9th annual "POOCH PLUNGE" recognized internationally, is open to all dogs irrespective of breed or pedigree with exception that dogs taking part in professional entertainment are not eligible.

Sponsored by the CNE, this swim is supervised by doctors of the Toronto Academy of Veterinary Medicine. Races start sharp at 11:00 a.m. with weigh-ins starting at 9:00 a.m. for the children's classes. Special classes for children 16 years and under have races for dogs under 25 pounds; 25 to 45 pounds, and over 45 pounds.

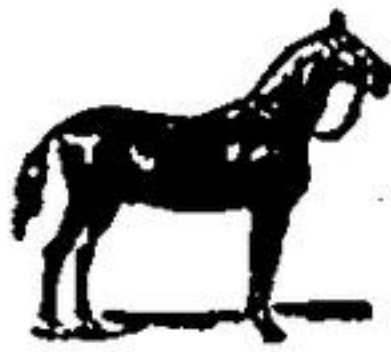
