### MEDITERRANEAN BUNGALOW

The kitchen-family room combination, with its corner fireplace and functional layout, will be the focus of the family's "at home" gatherings or more social entertaining. Sliding doors connecting to the patio and a barbecue grill built into the patio side of the fireplace encourage outdoor flying.

The location of the kitchen central to the dining and family room ensures maximum flexibility of entertainment styles: casual for family on one side, formal for friends on the other. 


