## Herbie, the foxy VW, is back

The plot is predictable. The characters follow the pattern set for any Walt Disney film; but Herbie Goes To Monte Carlo is a film that set children howling with laughter.

Herbie Goes To Monte Carlo is the third in a series of films about the Lovebug, the spunky Volkswagen which sent his second class racing driver to first standing in the biggest box office grossing film of 1969.

The attributes of the film, Herbie's ability to have feelings, continued in the 1974 film Herbie Rides Again which didn't quite make the top, but finished fifth in the annual

race for box office receipts. And now we have Herbie falling in love.

Sounds corny. And it is.

The foxy VW with eyes that roll, a mind of its own and the ability to communicate does it again. He falls helplessly in love with an expensive Lancia automobile while both cars take part in a cross-France road race.

The film almost in its entirety was shot on location in Paris, the French countryside and in Monte Carlo. The color is breathtaking in some scenes if you can take yourself away from the "action" long enough to notice.

And the plot also has its assortment of villains. They

consist of three would be robbers of the world's largest diamond, including a police inspector, and two rather offensive race drivers who underrate the little Lovebug's ability to make a comeback in racing after 12 years off the circuit.

One of the most profound scenes with some of the best acting in many years to come to the screen is portrayed by a Parisian sidewalk cafe waiter who witnesses the two cars spooning and then driving away—without drivers!

Dean Jones recaptures the role he created in the original 1969 film and Don Knotts is a natural for the role of the nervous but shy and reserved

mechanic.

Romantic interest is highlighted with a woman's lib portrayal by Julie Sommars, the driver of the Lancia named Giselle.

The film is filled with key-stone cops chases, fumbling incoherent French detectives and the Lovebug crew.

As family entertainment Herbie Goes To Monte Carlo is a must film. It's not that everyone will come away enjoying the improbable plot, but it's one of the few family films around that manages to be entertaining and suitable for the younger set.

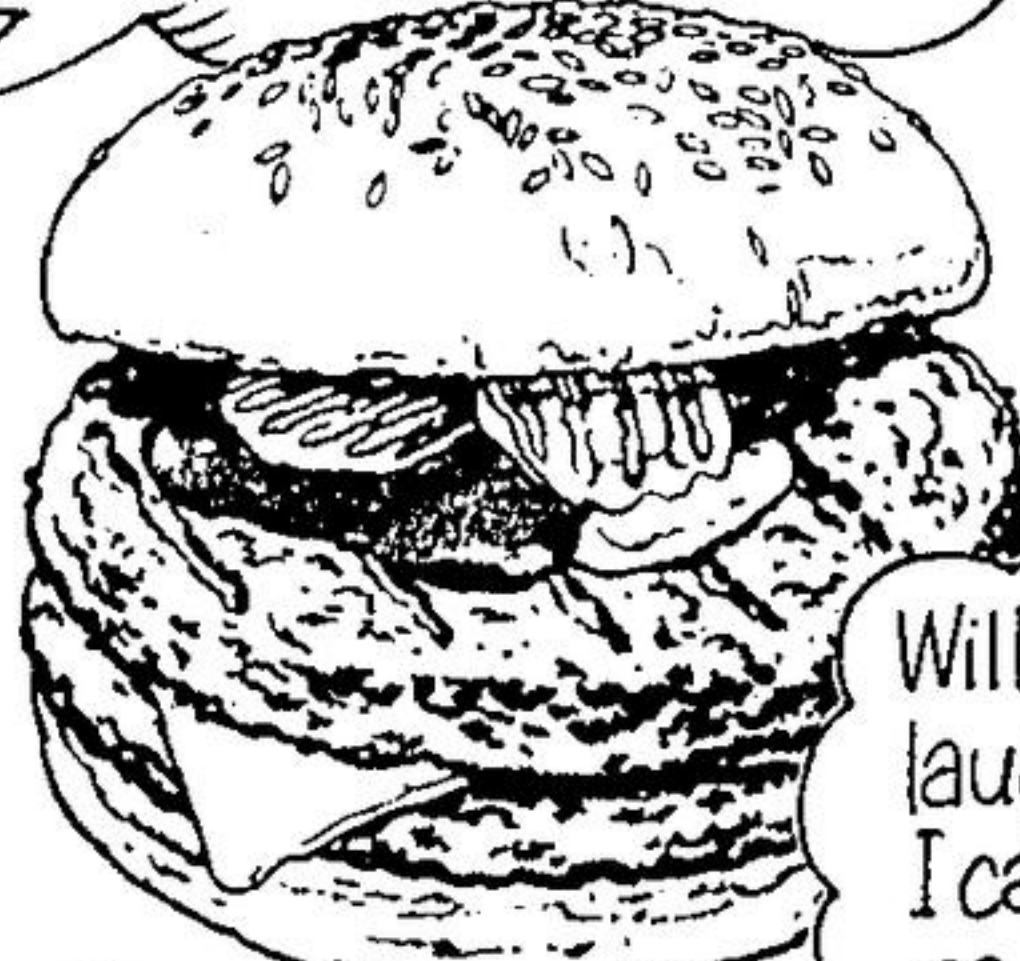

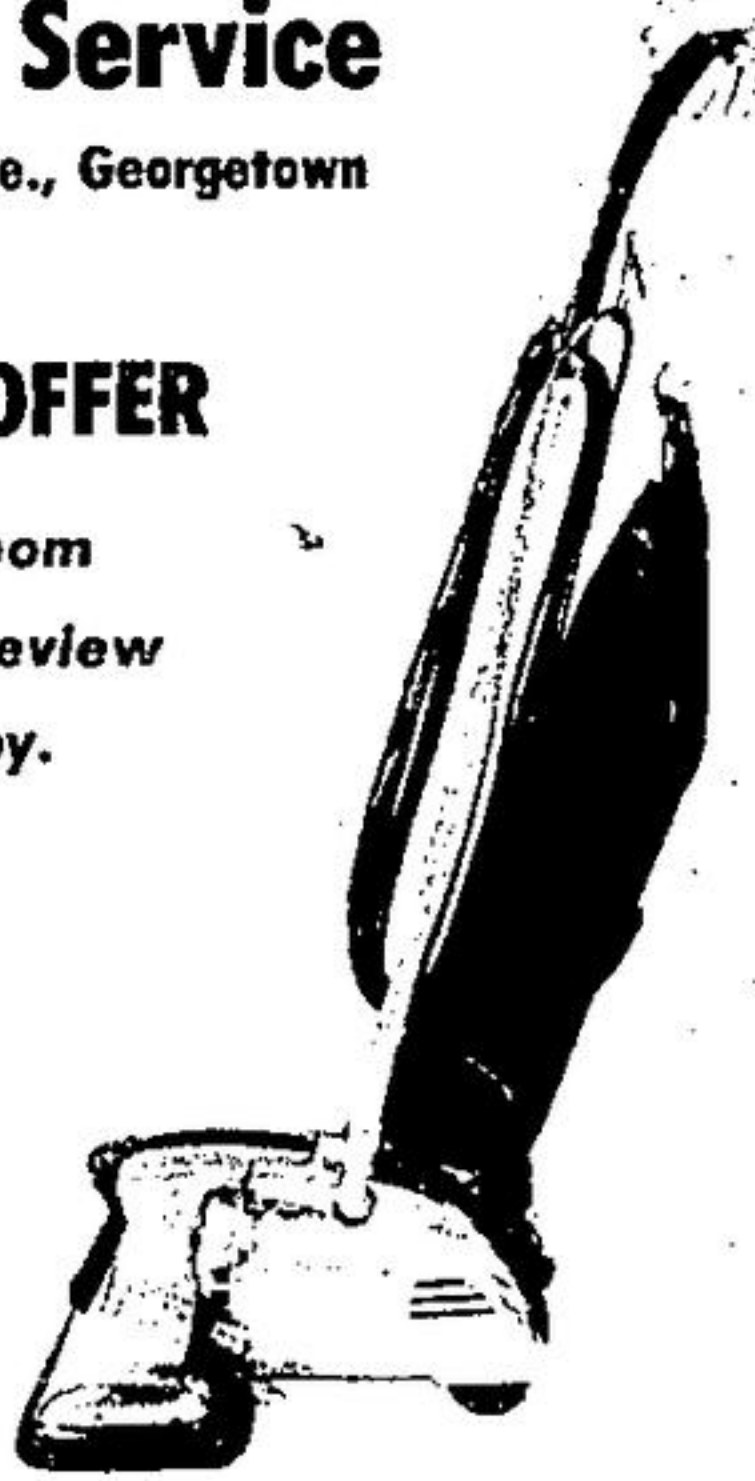
