

GRACIOUS BRICK BUNGALOW

This three bedroom full basement bungalow is well-suited to the large frontage lot

and the growing family. The pleasant low profile exterior, finished in brick and stone veneer is accented by a

charming bow window and spacious recessed front entry. The entrance hall leads to the large ell-shaped living and dining room. The living room features a raised brick hearth fireplace which, together with the square paned

bow window, creates a focal point for relaxed family living. The large kit hen and dining nook combination enables the family to separate formal dining and casual family meals. It may be closed off from the dining area and hall with sliding doors.

The kitchen itself features large working surfaces and generous cupboard and storage space. A third door leads from the kitchen to the rear entry and downstairs bathroom.

All three bedrooms are large, with good-sized closets accented by louvered bi-fold doors. The master bedroom features a two piece ensuite bathroom with a window to the rear yard.
