For example, we have a fair number of track and field youngsters and adults in the district. Where are their facilities? Cyclists? Others? I am suggesting the formation of a sports and recreational council to make concerned approaches to the authorities for better facilities. If we want our children to participate in winter and summer activities we must ensure that the facilities are provided as was the case with hockey and baseball. As the major summer activity in the district by far, we are deserving of better treatment.
