Co-ordinates medical, professional & related services for selected patients, whose hospital stay could be shortened or hospital admission prevented by providing care in the home.

### POISON CONTROL PROGRAM

Follow up by Community Health Nurses to stress Safety & Health education & provide emotional support.

### ALCOHOLIC PROGRAM

Provides supportive services to families involved with Alcoholism in conjunction with Addiction Research Foundation and Joseph Brant Memorial Hospital.

### NUTRITION EDUCATION CLASSES

To discuss benefits of sound nutritional practice and the effects of food on health & fitness. Weight Control is stressed.

### HEALTH INFORMATION & BIRTH CONTROL CLINIC

Weekly health information & birth control clinic providing:

- education & counselling re: human reproductive system.
- birth control
- V.D.
- health concerns
