SHE? Yes, hockey for the girls is an accomplished fact and thriving in Georgetown. Two years ago a very progressive Georgetown and District Minor Hockey Association joined the rapidly expanding movement of girls to hockey by establishing a Girls League in their house league system.

Not ringette or a modified version but the same hockey as played by the guys. Girls wear the proper hockey equipment plus the helmet with complete face protection and hockey skates.

Girls from 18 down to 6 are eligible to play this year. Those up to 8 play in the Tyke league, from 9 to 13 in the Junior Division and from 14 to 18 in the Senior Division.

Last year the senior girls played exhibition games against the Hillsburg, Orangeville, Inglewood League, Oakville, Brampton and Bramalea and participated in the Canadettes Brampton Tournament while the Junior girls participated in their division play and the house league Day of Champions.

Pre-registration is a must and there are two days left in which to register. This is important in determining how many teams and their playing schedules.

Fees are \$22.00 for one, \$34.00 for two and \$46.00 for three or more in the same family. Proof of age and a parent or guardian signature are required. Tonight (Wednesday) registration is from 7 to 9 p.m. than on Saturday from 9 a.m. to 12 noon, both times at Gordon Alcott Arena.

During the day, lightweight, casual, easy-care clothes such as shorts, halter tops, sundresses, and comfortable cover-ups for the ladies. Men will want shorts, T-shirts, sports shirts and slacks. Don't forget to pack a swimsuit or two, beach robe, sandals and sneakers.
