Model rebate refused

Works committee turned down a request by H and C Investments for a bylaw amendment to release them from a model home agreement which prevents them from selling a model home in their subdivision behind Princess Anne Drive and Charles Street.

Ward 3 Coun. Pete Pomeroy felt that it was unwise of the committee to force the developer to forfeit the \$1,750 fee which he paid for the model home because the loss would only be passed on to the buyer and housing prices are already high.

Works committee chairman Mike Armstrong disagreed saying that the developer knew he would lose the money if he sold the house before the services were installed. He has already given up the deposit for the first house so he knows what the agreement entailed, Coun. Armstrong pointed out.

"Who's to say it will be passed on to the buyer if we do refund his money?" Coun. Armstrong wanted to know. "We are setting a precedent that we might have to live up to if we amend the bylaw to suit the developer."

January 1st/77 - December 31/77
FEE \$1.00

Every resident of the Town of Halton Hills owning or using a Bicycle shall obtain a Licence on or before the 31st day of December of each year and such licence shall expire on the 1st day of January in the year following.

A Licence may be obtained by applying to the Municipal Offices of the Town of Halton Hills located at 36 Main Street South, Georgetown, and 40 Mill Street East, Acton, Monday - Friday 8:30 - 4:30 and also at North Halton Sports, 71 Main Street South, Georgetown during store hours.

It should be noted that when you purchase a Bicycle Licence, your serial number is recorded at the Town Office as well as being registered with Bicycle Guild in Montreal. This helps your Police Department in tracing stolen Bicycles.

When applying for your Bicycle Licence we require the make of the Bicycle, the manufacturers serial number and your name and address.

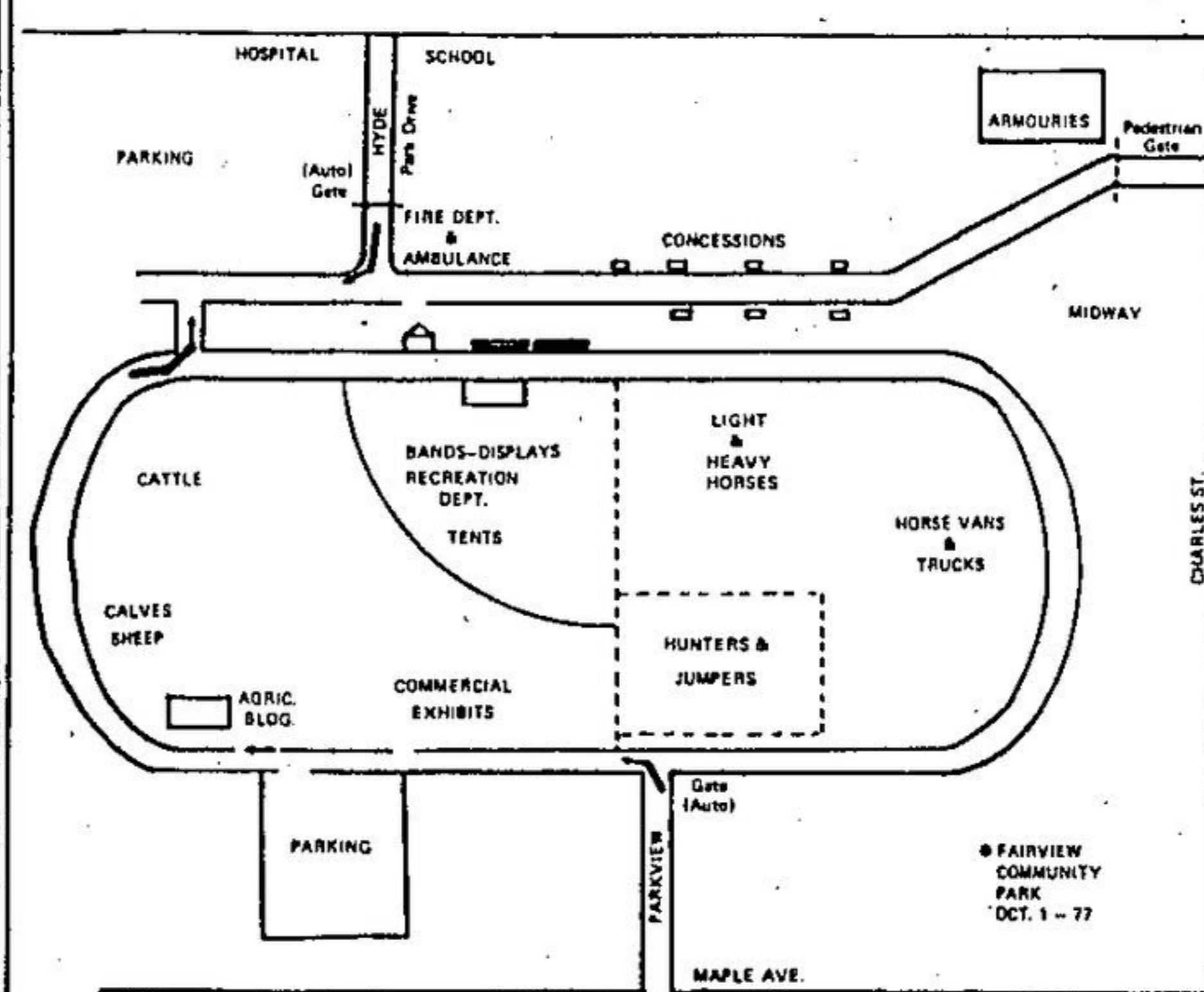
