

Fall fair Saturday

The Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food says the majority of fall fairs are held from mid-August to October and with this in mind, Georgetown fair is one of the last on Oct. 1.

These popular fairs have been in existence since 1792 when the Governor of Upper Canada, John Graves Simcoe, was a patron of the first fair at Niagara-on-the-Lake.

Since that beginning over 180 years ago, fall fairs, as they are widely known, have flourished, with over 230 going strong.

The agricultural societies behind these fairs draw most of their strength from the rural population, although more and more urban people are taking part. Competing against your neighbors is a big part of a fall fair.

Agricultural fairs attract people from miles around. They also appeal to those who have left the farm and want to return to see the fair.

They attract others who have never lived on a farm—who bring their children to the exhibiting of light and heavy horses, dairy and beef cattle, and sheep to watch the judging.

Like Georgetown, most fairs have midway for the younger visitors and there is entertainment by local talent to fill the day. The various exhibits and classes in sewing, quilts, arts and crafts, children's work, home baking, flowers and vegetables round out a visit to the fairs.

The home town fair which starts on Friday of this week with the big day on Saturday should be the biggest event of the year, weather permitting. So bring along your exhibits, fill the halls and the grounds and help make the fair one outstanding event.

Something to remember about the local fair is that pedestrian traffic only will be permitted at the Park Street entrance.

Vehicle traffic will enter the grounds by the Parkview and Park School entrances. This is a departure from previous years and necessitated to spread the parking over a larger area.
