They attract others who have never lived on a farm who bring their children to the exhibiting of light and heavy horses, dairy and beef cattle, and sheep to watch the judging.

Like Georgetown, most fairs have midways for the younger visitors and there is entertainment by local talent to fill the day. The various exhibits and classes in sewing, quilts, arts and crafts, children's work, home baking, flowers and vegetables round out a visit to the fairs.

The home town fair which starts on Friday of this week, with the big day on Saturday should be the biggest event of the year, weather permitting. So bring along your exhibits, fill the halls and the grounds and help make the fair one outstanding event.

Something to remember about the local fair is that pedestrian traffic only will be permitted at the Park Street

Vehicular traffic will enter the grounds by the Parkview and Park School entrances. This is a departure from previous years and necessitated to spread the parking over a larger area.
