

## Two artists in Oakville show

Two local artists will be involved in this year's Tenth Annual Outreach Exhibition and Sale of Art, Crafts and Antiques in Oakville.

Lotte Zonnenberg and Melanja Bray are two of over 75 exhibitors taking part in this year's event, which is being held on Friday Oct. 21 at St. John's United Church in Oakville. Both the local artists displays come under the craft section of the exhibition. Mrs. Zonnenberg of Georgetown will be displaying pewter, and Mrs. Bray of Acton will be showing examples of floral art.

Other displays include decoupage, design crochet, batik, stained glass, weaving, puppets, leathercrafts, pottery and hooked rugs. Oakville artist Alice Wynne will be showing her paintings, and she and Gloria Marshall will each have a painting for Silent Auction. The antique dealers will have displays of furniture, china, glassware and other collectibles.

For those interested in gift-buying, The Boutique on the main level, will offer Christmas decorations, macrame, woven pillows and picture frames, among other items.

The proceeds from the Outreach Sale are distributed to charities through World Outreach. Last year's recipients were the Dondi Hospital in Angola, Armagh House for young women in Mississauga, the Six Nations Reserve, Wayside House for men in St. Catharines, the Research Department of the Canadian Leprosy Missions and the Cape Croker Indian Reserve.

## Church walk draws 310

One woman tumbled down a muddy slope, two portions of the chosen route were flooded and 310 walkers were soaked under a steady downpour, but through it all the annual Peel Ecumenical Outreach Walk carried on.

"It was fantastic considering the weather," said John Brisley, the walk coordinator.

"Considering the day, it was a pretty good success and a reflection of the kind of people we have in Peel," he added.

The kind of people they had in Peel on Saturday were reminiscent of what used to be said of the postman. Brisley said rain had been predicted for the walk day all Friday and when the downpour came on Saturday, few hedged.

"I would say about 25 per cent of the walkers did not show," he said. Last year the walk attracted 400 persons under more ideal conditions.

The annual walk is organized by churches to raise funds for local charitable programs such as Bridge in Brampton and Mississauga programs like Distress Line, Cheshire House, the Ecumenical Centre and Meals on Wheels.

Brisley expects more than \$10,000 was raised for the local charities, below the \$15,000 target but equalling the total raised last year.

Walkers were scheduled to complete 22 kilometres along the Bruce Trail but their route was curtailed by flooding along two portions of the route. Brisley said one woman

slipped and fell down a muddy slope, but otherwise no walkers were injured.

"Whether people completed the walk or not I am sure sponsors will pay the full amount because they really deserve it," said Brisley.

"People were suffering out there."

## Aid the Contact Centre

North Halton Contact Centre, a non-profit, confidential information telephone, suicide crisis intervention, and befriending service is seeking community volunteers.

Starting Oct. 26 a training course for volunteers will be conducted. What is required are volunteers who can give 12 hours a month in three to four hour shifts.

The spokesman says inexperienced need not be a drawback since "we are not all experts; we do not have all the answers to all problems."

"What we do have are volunteers who care," the spokesman said. "Who are willing to get involved."
