Actonians prepare reply

Actonians for Action, a group of citizens who are trying to get a review of regional government in Halton, are going to meet this week to draft another letter to Darcy McKeough, treasurer and minister of inter-governmental affairs.

Peter Papillon, chairman of the group said Monday that the contents of the letter has not yet been decided but that when it is, a copy will be released to the press.

The treasurer wrote to the group that is not in favor of a review of regional government in Halton because it is premature and reviews are currently underway in other regions with the result that the ministry has neither the manpower or financial resources to do another.

Meanwhile, Herb Epp, a Liberal MPP for Waterloo-North, is heading a task force to study local and regional government in Ontario. In an interview with The Herald, Mr. Epp said the task force would be coming to Halton after the Christmas season.
