HEALTH FOR ALL Lungs at work

Nonsmokers and smokers are joining forces. Finally.

The overwhelming majority of both groups think separate smoking and no-smoking sections in public places are a fine idea. In a survey of more than 9,000 residents in six counties it was found that 68 per cent of smokers and 78 per cent of nonsmoker favoured the idea. Another national survey done by the government showed that the majority of both groups across the country think smoking should be banned in more public places.

In the six county survey, nonsmokers and ex-smokers also pin-pointed the places - public and private - where smoking disturbs them most. The results are fascinating

Health council recommendations come after ministry, hospital figures reviewed

The Halton district health council will make recommendations regarding extended care facilities in Halton Hills but the discrepancy between figures supplied by the ministry of health and those supplled by Georgetown and District Memorial hospital must be resolved first, council chairman Terry Baines said Mon-

There are two studies of extended care facilities in Halton being carried out, one by the ministry of health and one by the district health council, Mr. Baines said. Once the correct statistics are arrived at, the council will make its recommendations to the min-

almost any other area. "It isn't as if we're badly off - but the ministry of health would be the first to admit we may have a maldistribution of

facilities" he said. The hospital has made a very reasonable proposal, Mr. Baines added, but at the moment, the ministry is saying they have no money for this.

The cost constraints at the ministry are substantial, and you have to have a lot of material to throw back at the Ministry to defeat their statistics." Mr.Baines said.

At present, there is a freeze on the building of extensions for the purpose of extended care due to cost constraints.

"It would be two to three years before an addition could be completed, even with the approval of the ministry" Mr. Baines concluded, "We think we're doing the community a service by studying the proposal thoroughly for six or seven months"


