acclaimed to the post. Public relations committee chairman for 1977 Bonnie Brown also stepped down and her place was filled by Father J. Mihm of Oakville.


A special seven member building committee to oversee the construction of the birth school which the board will be building soon was also set up authough members to sit on the committee have not been appointed yet.
