Telephone directory again splits town's calling areas

When your fingers go walking through the 1978 edition of the Halton-Peel telephone directory, which is being delivered in the area for the next five weeks, residents, but subscribers in Georgetown will still need a Waterloo phone book for the number of a subscriber in the Acton area.

Bill Barnes, public relations manager for Bell Canada told The Herald in an interview Friday that in the last survey of subscribers in Acton before 1976, there was almost an even split with 51 per cent wanting to stay in the Guelph-area phone book, and 49 per cent wanting inclusion in the Halton-Peel book.

Mr. Barnes said another survey may be considered soon and that it would take a majority of 60 per cent to have the Acton subscribers listed in the Halton white pages, but they won't be listed in both books.

The new telephone directories have lime green covers with pictures of wild flowers in Ontario.

Besides the traditional Yellow Pages, which contain listings from Brampton, Georgetown, Milton-Campbellville, Mississauga, Oakville and Orangeville there is a section of blue pages which contain consumer aids, household hints and community maps.

Subscribers in Georgetown can request free copies from the telephone company of the directory containing the Acton listings and vice-versa, Mr. Barnes said.

This year's telephone directory "is quite a bit heavier than last year's," he said. In Hal-

Radios to be installed in Halton school buses

Two-way radios will be standard equipment on all public school buses in Halton, the board of education has decided.

The move, which will cost taxpayers \$15,000 for the board's fleet of 13 buses, was part of a package designed to improve the safety, service, communication and policies of the public school bussing system in the region. Two-way radios on private fleets carrying Halton school children will up the fare about \$100 a year per bus.

The board turned down creation of a \$20,000 a year position of a transportation officer to administer the bussing program. The system will continue to be the responsibility of area superintendent Harley Lishman.

The recommendations — 12 under safety, five under service, 10 under communication, two under general and one for policy — arose out of a bad storm last winter in which operation of the bus system broke down in parts of the region including that around Pineview school on Trafalgar Road in Halton Hills.

Trustees approved all the safety recommendations which are that drivers get basic training in bus operation to make the daily inspections of buses before operation meaningful; and training in recognized first aid which the board will assist in.

Other safety recommendations approved are that pick up locations be at the most visible location and at least 1,000 feet a part unless conditions dictate otherwise; that the principal ensure safe loading practices are employed and that a teacher supervise students boarding buses; that the bus safety program be for all bused students in conjunction with the safety branch of the police department in Halton; and that school bus safety patrols should operate on all elementary school bus routes except for non-hour Kindergarten.

More safety recommenda-

7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the elementary level for regular routes. The guidelines for eligibility are on Page 17
