## Norval association acclaims Art Reinhardt

Art Reinhardt, the man who spearheaded a drive last year for extension of water services into Norval, has been acclaimed president of the village community association.

He succeeds Hugh McFarlane who retired after three years on the executive.

"There are many things yet to be done," Mr. McFarlane told the third annual meeting of the group. He suggested a list of area businesses "so that we can get more business generated within and even co-operative advertising to get more business from without."

He urged caution of the incomplete plans for a four-lane highway through the village and told members to "keep abreast of traffic counts and see that the village isn't spoiled."

It would cost an estimated \$50,000 to restore the building, but "there has been no stampede of volunteers" and not one use for the building has been suggested, he said.

Mr. McFarlane suggested the building could become the site of a tennis court where a plaque would be raised marking the spot of the old school. But should the building be demolished then there would have to be some agreement on the group's continued use of the present school facility.

The school has been used actively in the past year, he said, noting that in November there were 42 permits issued for the community group to use the facility.

In other business the association approved \$9,067.18 for

improved sodium vapor lighting along village streets. Cost would be debentured over five years and result in a \$25.10 cost per housing unit per year. Maintenance of the lighting would then drop to \$3.85 per year per residence.

Georgetown Hydro was awarded the contract for installation of the 42 lights.

Also joining the executive of the association is Helen Murray, Dr. J. A. Thomas and Joe Gombocz.

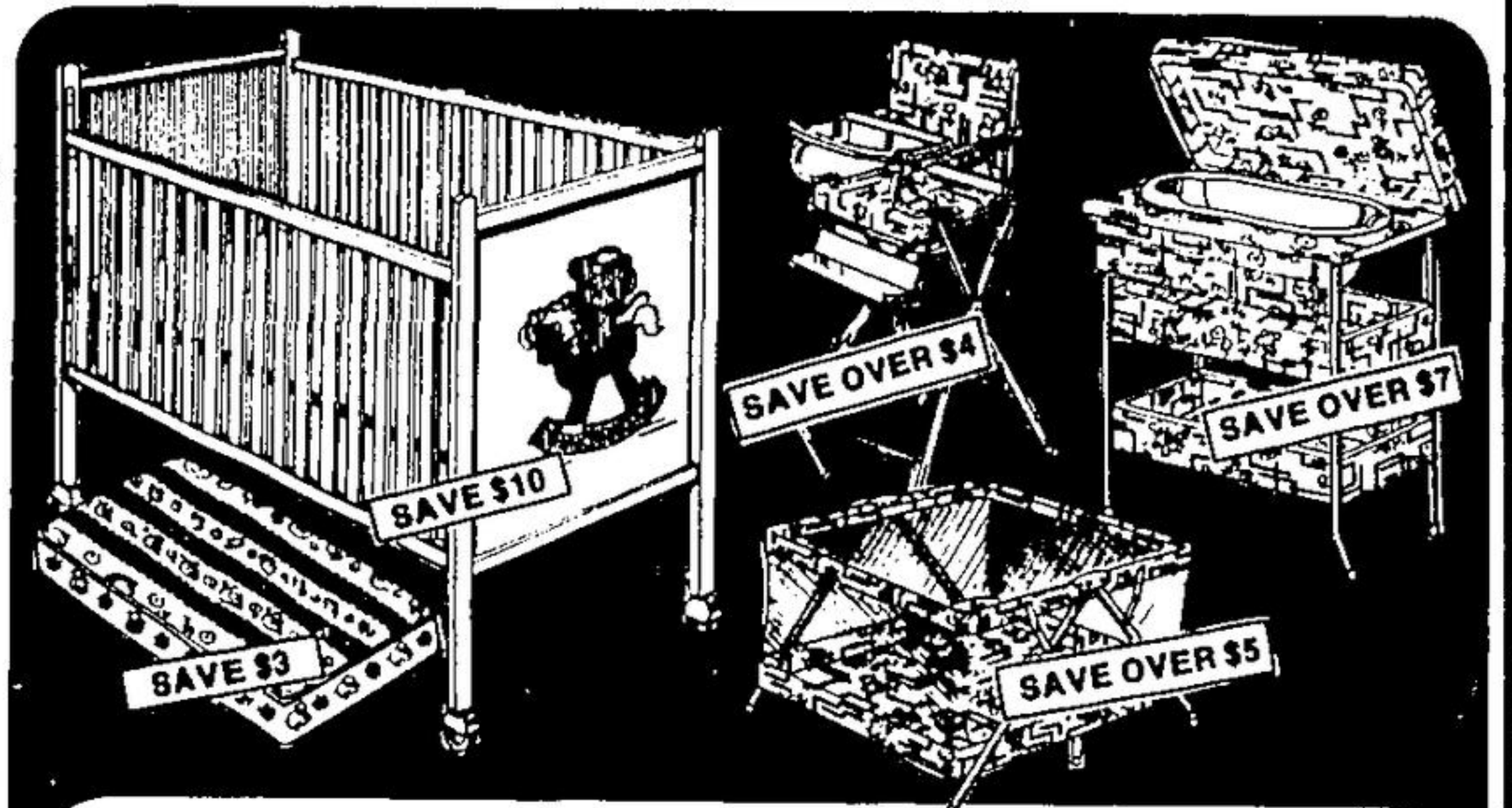

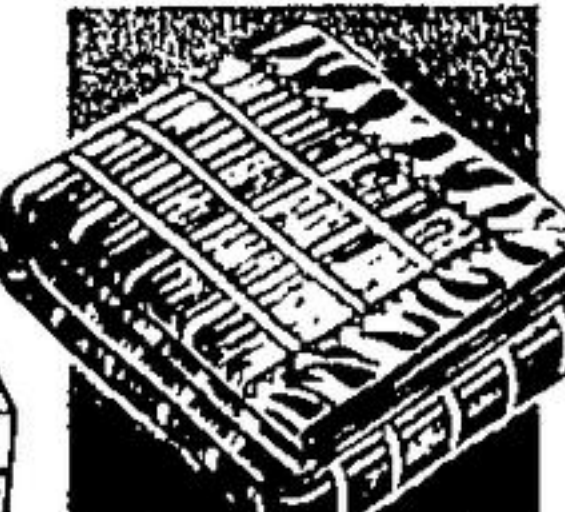
