Raiders rob Merchants two score hat tricks

The Georgetown Chrysler Haiders got hat tricks from Bob Fotheringham and Tom Daley to down the determined. but undermanned Dundas Merchants 6-3 at Alcott Arena

on Friday night. The Merchants only had 11 skaters and by the third period the Raiders were all over them. The win gives the Raiders a five-point bulge over the Merchants who are in second place in the O H.A. Intermediate "A" standings.

One of the biggest crowds of the season, approximately 650 people, was on hand to watch the battle between the two top clubs In the first period it appeared the Merchants were going to spoil it for the crowd as they jumped off to a 2-0 lead before the period was eight minutes old

Just 1:45 after the opening face off, captain Greg Higson put the visitors on the board on a shot from the faceoff circle which eluded Raider net-

minder Mario MacDonald. Joe Pecarie put the Merchants up 2-0 Pecaric was set up in the slot and let a shot fly which MacDonald had little chance on.

Daley finally put the Raiders on the board 12.55 into the period. The Merchants had just finished killing a penalty, but the Raiders kept the pressure on Brad Butterworth let a shot go from the point and Daley collected the rebound and put it into an empy net. The period neded with the

Evans and Daley have been playing together the entire season and they complement one another perfectly. Evans throws out what appear to be blind passes, but they seem to always end up on Daley's stick. Kudrasovs and Fotheringham both possess

excellent speed and they ran the Merchants ragged Fotheringham put the Raiders in the lead for the first time five minutes into the final minute. Kudrasovs and Fotheringham broke in on a two-on-one break and the centreman put a pass right on winger's stick

Fotheringham then beat Restivo on his glove side. The Raiders went up by two goals 8:42 into the period when
