Raiders rob Merchants two score hat tricks

The Georgetown Chrysler Raiders got hat tricks from Bob Fotheringham and Tom Daley to down the determined, but undermanned Dundas Merchants 6-3 at Alcott Arena on Friday night.

The Merchants only had 11 skaters and by the third period the Raiders were all over them. The win gives the Raiders a five-point bulge over the Merchants who are in second place in the O.H.A. Intermediate "A" standings.

One of the biggest crowds of the season, approximately 650 people, was on hand to watch the battle between the two top clubs. In the first period it appeared the Merchants were going to spoil it for the crowd as they jumped off to a 2-0 lead before the period was eight minutes old.

Just 1:15 after the opening face-off, captain Greg Hinson put the visitors on the board on a shot from the faceoff circle which eluded Raider netminder Mario MacDonald.

Joe Pecarie put the Merchants up 2-0 Pecarie was set up in the slot and let a shot fly which MacDonald had little chance on.

Daley finally put the Raiders on the board 12:55 into the period. The Merchants had just finished killing a penalty, but the Raiders kept the pressure on Brad Butterworth let a shot go from the point and Daley collected the rebound and put it into an empty net. The period ended with the Merchants ahead 2-1.

Dundas had a decided edge in play in the opening period. The Raiders did not appear to be sharp and managed to get only two shots on Sam Restivo. The Merchants had eight on MacDonald.

The homeside look over in the middle frame had it not been for the great work of Restivo, the Raiders could have run up the score. The netminder stopped Steve Blundy at the goal crease and saved off the stick of Daley.

The only Raider who managed to get the puck past Restivo was Fotheringham. He was set up perfectly by Juri Kudrasovs, who threw a pass from behind the Merchant net to Fotheringham. The winger made no mistakes in beating Restivo.

Mario MacDonald was not nearly as busy as his counterpart, but he handled the seven shots fired at him in the period. Restivo made 16 saves.

The duos of Daley and Evans and Kudrasovs and Fotheringham controlled play for the final two periods. Evans and Daley have been playing together the entire season and they complement one another perfectly. Evans throws out what appear to be blind passes, but they seem to always end up on Daley's stick. Kudrasovs and Fotheringham both possess excellent speed and they ran the Merchants ragged.

Fotheringham put the Raiders in the lead for the first time five minutes into the final minute. Kudrasovs and Fotheringham broke in on a two-on-one break and the centreman put a pass right on his winger's stick.

Fotheringham then beat Restivo on his glove side.

The Raiders went up by two goals 8:42 into the period when Daley scored the evening's only power-play goal. The Raiders applied tremendous pressure on the Merchants and Daley finally beat Restivo, with Pecarie, who was forced to guard the net after his netminder was drawn out of the play.

After the Daley goal it was a matter of how many the Raiders would put past Restivo. That is not to say that the Merchants gave in. They just did not have the legs to play with homeside, who by this time had run their opponents ragged.

Fotheringham completed his hat trick with four minutes left in the game when he put a Bill Currie rebound home. Kudrasovs earned his third assist of the night on the play.

Hugh Prentice gave the visitors a glimmer of hope when he beat MacDonald shortly after the Fotheringham goal. But that hope dissipated when Daley scored his third goal with just over two minutes left to play. Evans and Blundy earned assists.
