Cindy and David McGilloway to skate together at Carnival

At the upcoming Acton Figure Skating Club's carnival. Cindy and Dave McGilloway will be skating dance pairs together. The carnival is an annual show put on at the end of the figure skating season, usually in early April.

Although Cindy and Dave McGilloway have never skated

in competition together because they are not on the same level (Cindy Is on her 5th figure of 8, while Dave is on his 4th), Cindy usually partners him in practice, and when he is taking a test. Both have competed separately, Dave having won home competitions while Cindy has also won competitions outside of Acton. Over the weekend, Cindy and

Diane Baginski, also of the Acton Figure Skating Club, placed first in the similar pairs division of the Halton -Peel finals.

Figure skaling starter for both Cindy and Dave eight years ago. Cindy took up the sport for enjoyment, while Dave, who plays for the Acton Sabres, had first played hockey and started figure sknting "mainly to improve my hockey game, but after a while I got interested enough to continue." Dave feels figure to teach future skating. skating has, and still does improve his game greatly.

Both McGilloways admitted that although there are high points in skating, such as when they win a competition, pass a level, or master a difficult move, at times the constant year-round practice does get dreary and boring. When the ice is removed

from the Acton arena for the summer, Cindy and Dave skate in Guelph. Their coach is Malcolm Cannon, a transplanted Englishman who was British champion in dance and freestyle skating for five years and now teaches in Guelph. Both Cindy and Dave have skated out of Ontario once, when they attended a skating

seminar at Lake Placid, New York. It was a learning situation with "kids from all over the U.S. and Canada." says Dave. There were also "coaches from England, the U.S. and Canada," adds Cindy, "but we were the only kids from around this area, although there were some from

Preston and Montreal." In a few years Cindy plans to make her living from figure skating by teaching the sport to youngsters. Dave oots for a career in hockey, but plans to have figure skating as something to fall back on. His second career choice would be

Usually in figure skating, partners are chosen for each other who come from different towns, and even different skating clubs. Cindy feels that the closeness between Dave and her has helped their skating. "Skating brother and sister is easier I think, because we know each other, and each other's moves better." She believes they also get along quite well and don't let occasional spats hamper their skat-

ing together. Figure skating is an extremcly expensive sport, and the McGilloways parents have helped them tremendously in terms of money and moral encouragement to keep trying. and give it their best. Perhaps next year Cindy and Dave McGilloway will skate together in competitions as a dance pair.
