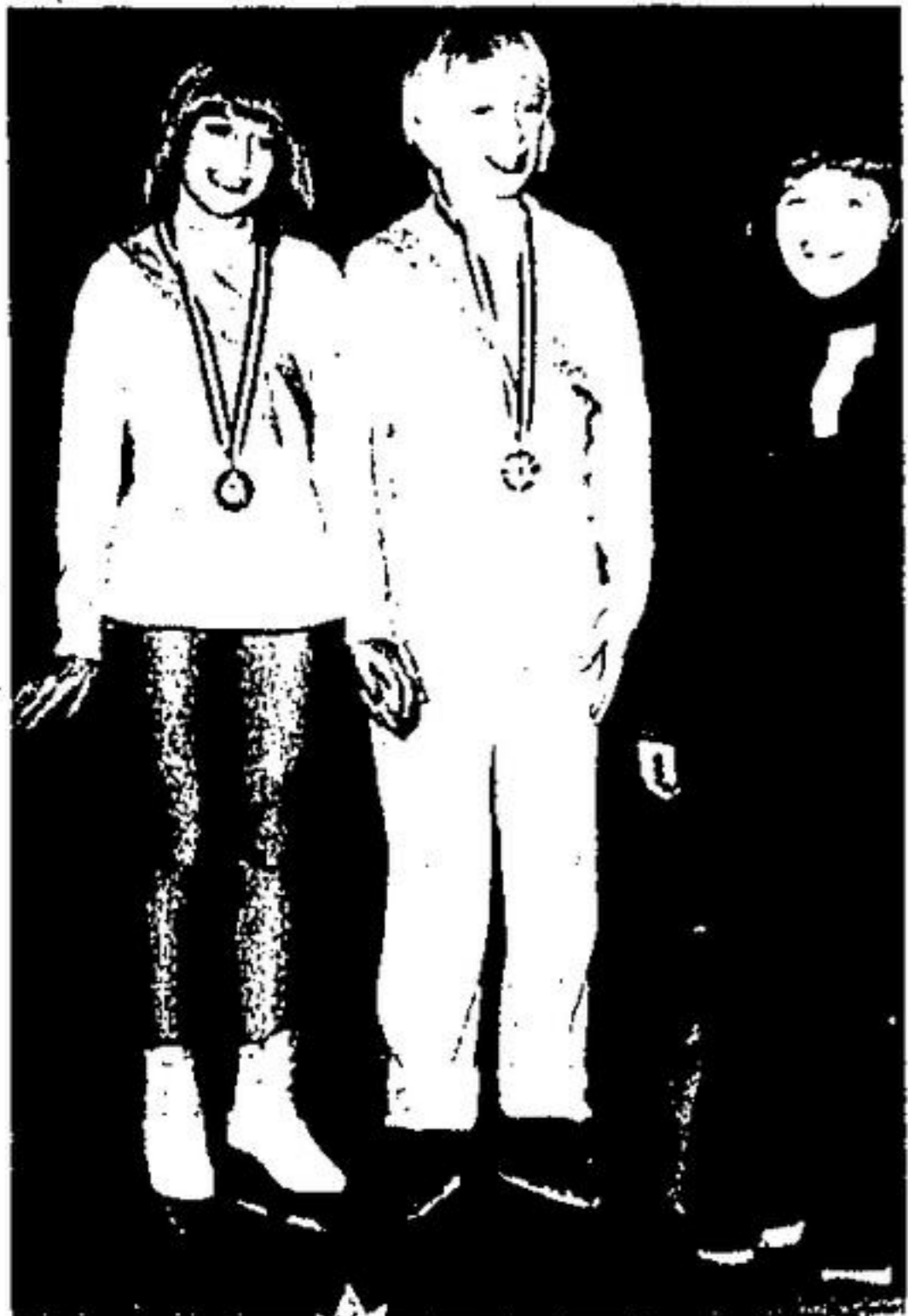

Cindy and David McGilloway to skate together at Carnival

At the upcoming Acton Figure Skating Club's carnival, Cindy and Dave McGilloway will be skating dance pairs together. The carnival is an annual show put on at the end of the figure skating season, usually in early April.

Although Cindy and Dave McGilloway have never skated

in competition together because they are not on the same level (Cindy is on her 5th figure of 8, while Dave is on his 4th), Cindy usually partners him in practice, and when he is taking a test. Usually in figure skating, partners are chosen for each other who come from different towns, and even different skating clubs. Cindy feels that the closeness between Dave and her has helped their skating. "Skating brother and sister is easier I think, because we know each other, and each other's moves better." She believes they also get along quite well and don't let occasional spats hamper their skating together.

Figure skating is an extremely expensive sport, and the McGilloways' parents have helped them tremendously in terms of money and moral encouragement to keep trying and give it their best. Perhaps next year Cindy and Dave McGilloway will skate together in competitions as a dance pair.
