## Police review town offices

Halton Police Commission is examining the possibility of relocating the Georgetown detachment of regional police.

The topic arose at the meeting last week when the commission was discussing the new offices for the Acton detachment. Commissioner David Coons expressed his dissatisfaction with conditions at both the Acton and Georgetown offices, and said, "I don't want Utopia, I just want our men to have a place they can be proud of."

Commissioner Coons said he was pleased with the location of the Acton office, and the staff had reported that the space is adequate.

"But I wasn't impressed at all with the interior, and I assumed there would have to be some dollars spent, either by Halton Hills, and charged back to us in rent, or by us directly," he said.

"The commission is very concerned with the ceiling problems in Georgetown," Commissioner Harry Barrett said. "(Commissioner) Glenn (Magnuson) is looking around, to

see what's available in the area."

"I don't think the idea of moving is being considered too seriously," Chief Ken Skerrett said later. "The building is falling apart and if we can't get it put back into condition that's liveable, we may have to move somewhere else."

The question of whether a washroom needed to be added to make the Acton office self-contained and separate from the other offices in the building was also discussed.

"I think it meets all the criteria which we've mentioned, but I would like to see it self-contained," Commissioner Coons said.

"It was my distinct impression that we were waiting solely for costing now," Commissioner Magnuson said. "Commissioner Barrett said that labor legislation might demand two washrooms be built, not one, as was being discussed."

It was moved that the Police commission be authorized to continue negotiations with the town of Halton Hills owners of the building, over the lease.

## Treat plants right

Clusters of 20 or 30 beautiful star-shaped, exquisitely-perfumed, creamy-pink blooms will appear on the wax plant, or boysa, if you treat it right. You also must be patient and lucky, says Bob Fleming, Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food horticulturist.

The reluctance of the wax plant to bloom not only adds to

its fascination, but also makes it a very frustrating house plant. Here are a few tips which should encourage the most stubborn example of plant to flower.

A south window is usually the best location for the plant as it needs as much light as possible. The thick, fleshy, waxy-looking leaves act as a fine water reservoir, so water the plant sparingly. The potting soil should be allowed to remain bone dry for days, even weeks, between waterings, especially during the winter.

Plant foods should be avoided, except during midsummer when an occasional dosage of a water-soluble fertilizer such as 20-20-20 can be given. Another important factor is to confine the root systems by avoiding large pots. If you have been patient, you may be rewarded between early March and May. Each cluster of blooms should last two or three weeks.

## Focal OK's easement

Focal Properties Ltd. has offered to sell to Halton Hills a 30 foot easement for a town owned - storm sewer pipe which was built on the company's land at the end of Sargent Road.

M.A. Millard, general manager of new communities for the developer, said in a letter to council Monday that the sale price is based on \$5,000 an acre.

The design for extension of the storm sewer to the creek is to be subject to the company's approval and all damage caused to company land must be corrected, Mr. Millard said. As well, all costs of extending the drain are the town's responsibility.

Council moved the offer be considered by the works department.
