BOOKS

Rideau Hall love affair

Art historian Dr. R.H. Hubbard says he "began a love affair" with Rideau Hall, residence of Canada's governors-general, during the term of native-born Vincent Massey from 1952 to 1959. The affair "intensified" during the term of Mr. Massey's successor, Georges Vanier. "Canadians can be thankful since the fruit is a handsome book, Rideau Hall (McMillan-Queen's University Press, Montreal; \$25) an illustrated history of Government House from Victorian times to 1977.
