

No prayers for unity

School children in Halton won't be praying for Canadian Unity.

Halton board of education Thursday defeated a motion by trustee H. H. (Bert) Hinton that the board contact the Hastings-Prince Edward Roman Catholic separate school to obtain a copy of prayer approximately 4,000 students say once a week to increase Canadian unity.

Trustee Hinton told reporters later that he is surprised, and stunned that the motion did not pass.

He said that he would be reintroducing the motion at a future board meeting and had the support of trustee John Bradley, a separate school supporter on the board.

"In view of the groping that goes on with regard to the importance of concern for Canadian unity," Mr. Hinton said, "it would seem that a prayer is perhaps the most constructive resource available as a cure for our problems."
