



Previous winners


Only one team has managed to win the Bantam Tournament three times

The Wannipeg "A" team pulled the trick in 1965, 1966 and again in 1969. That was also the last year they competed in the tournament. After that year the school break time in Manitoba did not coincide with the school break here so Winnipeg could not send a team

Three teams have taken the tournament on two separate occasions. Peterborough won in 1961 and 1973: Toronto Marlboros in 1962 and 1970 and Toronto Young Nationals in 1971 and 1972.

Other winners of the tournament were York Steel in 1961; Toronto "A" in 1964, Georgetown in 1967, Detroit Myr. Metal in 1968, Chinguacousy in 1974, Burlington in 1975, Detroit Bosquett in 1976 and Belleville last year.


Georgetown is only one of two non "A" leams to win the tournament. The others were Chinguacousy "B" in '74 and Belleville "B" last year. Georgetown is the only class "C" team to ever win, They have now moved up to the class "B" division.
