## Racquet Club executive to decide on expansion

The Georgetown Racquet Club will hold a special meeting of its 145 members March 20 at the club on Armstrong Ave. to decide whether to expand the club's squash facilities. Included in the expansion plans are two outdoor tennis courts.

The club is non-profit, member-owned, and administered by non-paid volunteers. Besides the tennis courts, the expanded club will have two international squash courts (it now has two North American size courts), a large spectator gallery, women's change and locker room, lounge and work-out rooms.

"The main purpose of our expansion is to provide facilities for the whole family," said Dr. Dave McEwen, club president.

"Our present building simply isn't large enough for family participation. Over the past several months there has been a growing demand for squash facilities for women and youngsters in the Halton Hills area."


The club is holding a drive for prospective members this month. The objective is to have a 175 members, at least one half eventually being family memberships, Dr. McEwen explained.

"Frankly, we need commitments from prospective members before March 20 to be reasonably certain that expansion plans will be approved by existing members," he said.

"We understand that a few people would rather wait until the new facilities are added before they apply to join. It's sort of a chicken or egg situation."

"To solve this problem, we are asking people to meet a deposit \$50 now as proof of their intention to join when the new facilities are completed.
