

Educators rap fed spending

Halton board of education. has rapped the knuckles of the federal government for a 9.8 per cent increase in spending in a time of restraint.

"Leadership must be shown at senior levels of government if the lower levels are to have an example to follow," said Oakville trustee William Priestner who proposed the

The board will also petition the federal government to reassess its need to increase spending to \$48.8 billion in a time of restraint.

Provincial treasurer Darcy McKeough has tried to limit public spending and the board has to go to its stall and say "restraint is the name of the game," trustee Priestner said. An amendment proposed by

trustee H.H. (Bert) Hinton that the board make restraint its purpose as an example to the federal government falled

The board has kept its spending for the next school year to an increase of 5.4 per cent or \$86,147,702.

Milton trustee Ivan Armstrong said he was in support of the motion because the federal government has failed to promote secondary industry. As well, trustee Armstrong added the federal government is secrelive about the money that they do spend. He said he has approached the MP twice but never received a return call on

his questions. As is usual when the board passes such a motion, it will be circulated to school boards

The committee's decision came after hearing a delegation from the recreation advisory committee for Wards 3 and 4 (Georgetown).



"Sometimes we didn't know how a particular program would affect the whole town," Mr. Riepma said.

The advisory committee also. discussed their terms of reference, maintenance and construction of facilities and how the committee could better serve the town.
