The play, *The Anniversary*, written by Bill MacLennan and directed by Gene Tichauer, a professional director, opens tonight at Howard Wrigglesworth school auditorium and runs through Saturday. Mom, played by Vera Macdonald gets a loving - or maybe not so loving - kiss

from sons Tom, Henry and Terry, played by Simon Joyner, Derek Joyner, and John Roe. The *Anniversary* is a three act presentation billed as a comedy, and employs "a farcical technique" - not in order to make the play more palatable to an audience, but in the belief that through laughter a facet of family truth can be accepted without the loss of sanity.

Arts festival planned

A unique experience is to take place in the Georgetown Fairgrounds on Saturday June 3 from 10 a.m. to 11 p.m. - a festival of the arts - SUMMER-FEST '78.

Hilton Hills Arts Council is sponsoring an opportunity for the many and varied art forms of Halton to come together to display, demonstrate, sell and entertain the public.

Throughout the day, musical presentations will be made by the Georgetown Choral Society as well as the Georgetown High School Band, the Georgetown Girls Pipe Band, a number of folk singing groups and a rock group also from the high school. Highland dancers and a senior ballet class will also be performing.

Phil Sykes and his music will be featured in a two hour concert to be held in the evening.

Georgetown Little Theatre has already started rehearsals for three performances to be put on throughout the day.

A number of marquis will house a variety of activities to appeal to all interests and ages. Arts and crafts, in the form of paintings, pottery, photographs, knitting, woodwork, batik and much more, will be displayed, and sold by local individual artists and art

groups; for example, the Credit Valley Artisans, the Arts and Crafts of Georgetown, The Georgetown Weavers Guild and the Palette and Pencil Club. The Esqueing Historical Society, the Horticultural Society and the Conservation Centre, in name a few, have also reserved display areas.

Opening ceremonies will begin at 1 p.m. with MPP Julian Reed, William Kriesel, a representative of the ministry of culture and recreation and other local dignitaries.

As with every festival, refreshments will be available

throughout the day. A beer garden will also be set up in the Armory.

With each ticket to Summerfest - 50 cents for adults, 25 cents for children, 12 and under - there is the opportunity to win a number of door prizes to be drawn at the evening concert. Tickets will be available at local stores and at the site.

On Sunday, May 28th, at the Georgetown McDonald's Restaurant children will have the chance to demonstrate their own artistic talent by painting their images of summer

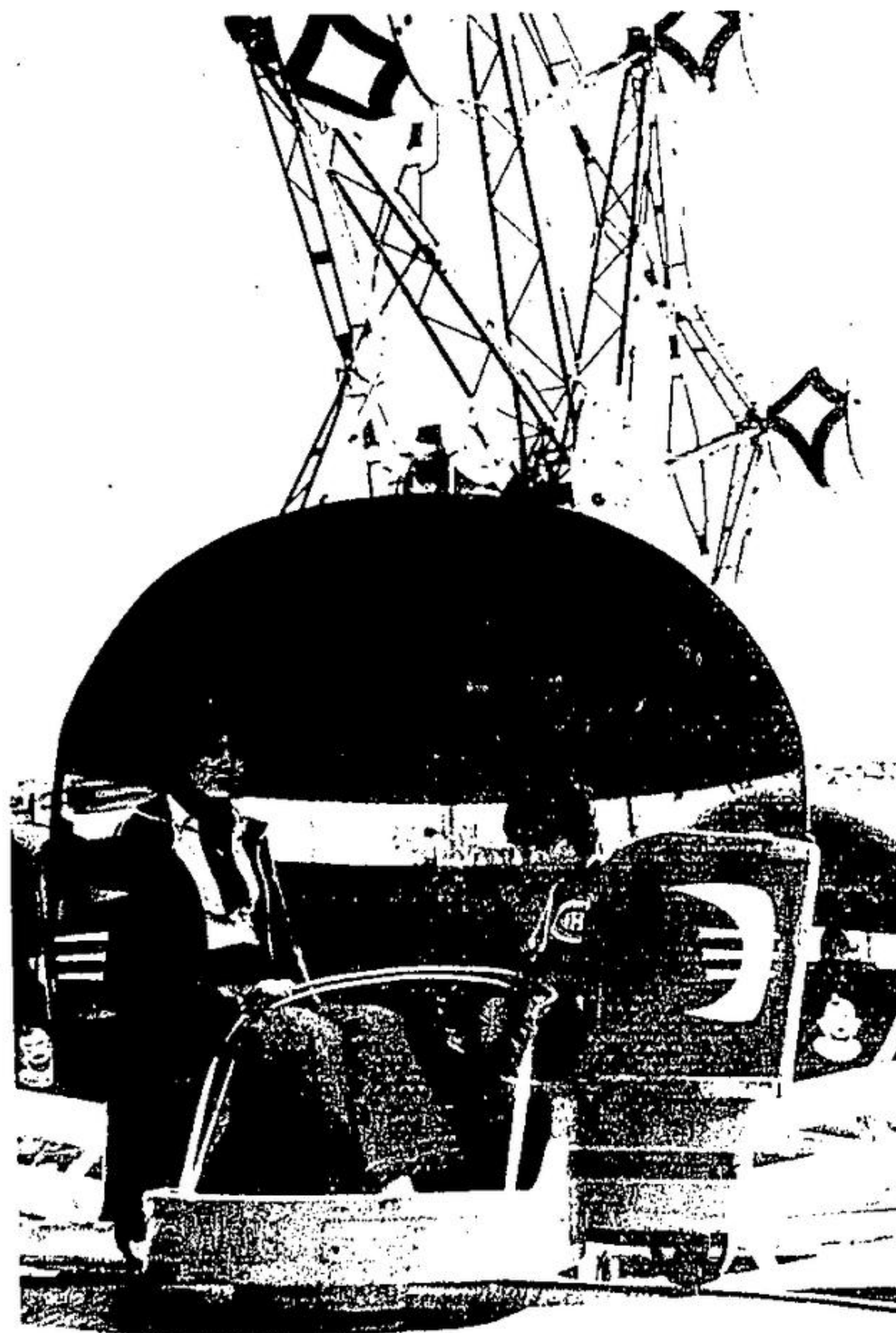

How to Raise Your Own

The Supple Souffle

The fluffy souffle is a thing of the past - now even the sophisticated woman can contribute. These days the most crucial step in the making of a souffle is the beating of the egg whites. Have the eggs at room temperature before starting. Then beat until they're shiny and soft enough to hold a good peak. Over beaten whites will "fall flat".

Then fold the sauce mixture into the egg whites very slowly to avoid air escape.

Crease only the bottom of the oven dish because the souffle's climb is water in upward only.

To conserve its status, serve your souffles, light, high souffle as soon as it is done.
