LAWN VOCABULARY

Ever stumbled over the meaning of a word in a lawn or garden article? Here are definitions for some of the more frequently used terms.

Annual, Any plant that germinates, matures, produces seed and dies within one year.

Chlorosis. A condition evidenced by yellow

Clay soll. A "heavy" soil that packs readily.

Complete fertilizer, Contains all of the major ingredients-nitrogen, phosphorus and potas-

Cool-season grass. Any grass that grows best in a moderate or cool zone. Example: bluegrass.

Dicot. A plant emerging from its seed with two leaves, such as dandelion. Includes "broadleaf" and "vining" weeds

Fertilizer "hurn." Injury to grass and plants by

Germination (also sprouting). The baby plant emerging, from its seed

Inorganic fertilizer, Produced from nunerals.

Loam. A desirable soil mixture of sand, silt thine-textured sediment) and clay,

Monocot, A plant emerging from its seed with one leaf such as grass.

Mulch, Usually a covering of organic material such as peat moss or straw, used to project seedlings, preserve moisture and present crosion

N.P.K. Chemical symbols for nitrogen(N), phosphorustP1 and potassium(K)-the major ingredients of fertilizer

Non-selective herbicide. A product capable of damaging all plants.

· Herbicides. Products used to control weeds.

• Insecticules. Products that control insects and, often, mites.

Postemergent herbicide. Destroys an custing growing plant.

Preemergent herbicide. Prevents germination or seedling growth of a plant.

Rennvate. Rebuilding a lawn using the existing lawn as the seedbed (soil is not turned over).

Rhizome, An underground stem

that can produce a new plant Selective herbielde. A product capable of destroying certain plants without damaging other

Stolon (also runner). A ground hugging stem that takes tool and produces a new plant.

Thatch, Accomplation of plant parts, debris, etc located between the leaf blades and the soil

Tiller. A side-shoot that forms from the base of a plant to produce new leaf blades.

Urea - A water soluble nitrogen compound. Ureaform. A water insoluble nitrogen com-

Warm-seasin grass. Any grass that grows best in a warm or semi-tropical zone. Example: ber-

mudagrass. Weed. Any plant growing where it is not wanted.

Chilly weather vegetables, If soil is ready for planting, don't let lingering winter temperatures hold you back. Spinach seed will sprout in soil at a cool 4 degrees - 13 degrees C; and peas, radishes and turnips at 10 degrees -16 degrees C. Beet and carrot seed can be sown in cool soil. but they will wait for warmer soil (18 degrees - 21 degrees C.) to germinate.

Head start schedule. Planting seeds indoors too early can cause a pile up of baby plants if it stays too cold or wet to place them outdoors. Start your indoor planting no sooner than about 6 to 10 weeks ahead of normal outdoor planting time. For instance, sow cool season crop seeds like broccoli and cabbage in late February for

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
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
