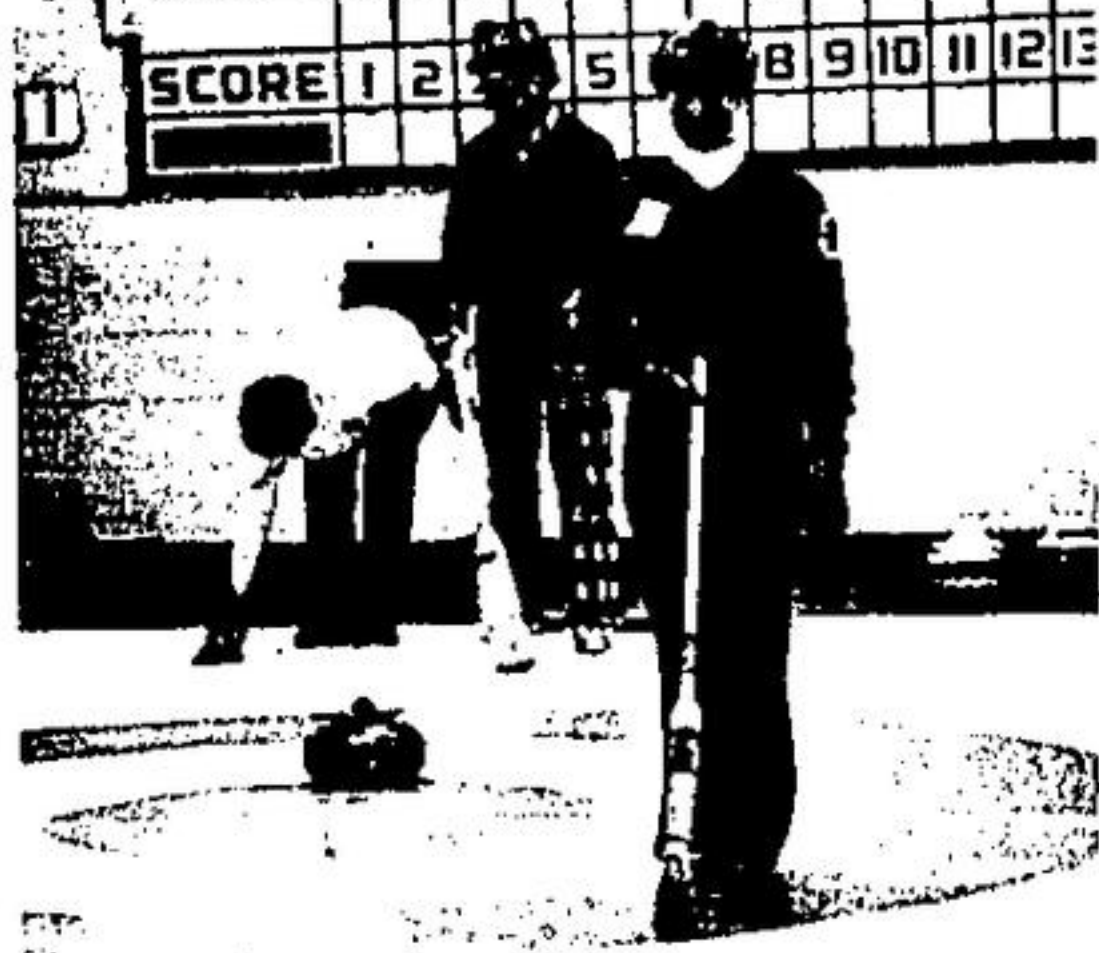

Broomhead, Latimer win club's Economy Run

The team of driver Glenn Broomhead of Toronto and navigator David Latimer of Georgetown won the Georgetown Motorsport Club Economy Run held last weekend. The Broomhead-Latimer team won in driving the 131.6-mile run in a Honda Accord. The weight of the car was 1.13 tons. They used 2.36 gallons on the run for an average of 55.76 miles per gallon. After that average was multiplied by the car's weight the winning ton-mpg was 63.01 for the team. The winning car was the lightest of the top eight finishers. Bill and Elaine Flett, of Bramata, finished second in a Plymouth Arrow. Their ton-mpg was 62.74. They used 2.79 gallons. Henry Matejko of Toronto and Alan Ryall of Mississauga finished third in their Volkswagen Rabbit with a 62.10 ton-mpg. Jim and Diane Justice of Erin were fourth having a 58.06 ton-mpg in their Fiat 128. Tom Thomassen of Thornhill and Harry Vaisanen of Unionville were fifth with a 57.52 ton-mpg in their Ford Capri. Neil and Mary Lou Young of Georgetown placed sixth in their Jaguar XJ6-L. They had the heaviest car in the top eight as their car the Jaguar weighed in at 2.26 tons. They averaged 23.46 mpg and their ton-mpg was 52.96. Kevin Jennings and Heather Madden of Orangeville with a

49.29 ton-mpg finished seventh in their Chevrolet Chevette. Risto and Eija Aanktibeb of Willowdale in a Datsun 510 with a 47.53 ton-mpg. The drivers had a maximum of four hours and 30 minutes to complete the route, which started and finished at the Fina Station on Guelph St. The idea for the rally was of course to get the best gas

mitenge. The drivers had three time checks and there were no penalties for missing the checks by "a little". The teams also had to answer 19 questions along the way. The team was penalized one mpg for missing a question. Missing a route control also cost one mpg as did each minute late at the end.

JANUARY 1st/78 - DECEMBER 31st/78 FEE \$1.00

Every resident of the Town of Halton Hills owning or using a Bicycle shall obtain a Licence on or before the 31st day of December of each year and such licence shall expire on the 1st day of January in the year following.

A Licence may be obtained by applying to the Municipal Offices of the Town of Halton Hills located at 36 Main Street South, Georgetown, and 40 Mill Street East, Acton, Monday - Friday 9:30 - 4:30 and also at North Halton Sports, 71 Main Street South, Georgetown, during store hours.

It should be noted that when you purchase a Bicycle Licence, your serial number is recorded at the Town Office as well as being registered with the Bicycle Guild in Montreal. This helps your Police Department in tracing stolen Bicycles.

When applying for your Bicycle Licence we require the make of the Bicycle, the manufacturer's serial number and your name and address.
